## What is the Glenn Hourigan Cup?

The Glenn Hourigan Cup contest began in 2003-04 following the great success of the annual Ross Turner Cup fixture, which was inaugurated in 1998-99 to promote an opportunity for our best junior players to appear in a 'showcase' game of high level representative cricket. The idea developed from the work of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council in the 1990's, which brought together representatives of grade, shires, district and school local cricket organisations to achieve mutual benefit by working in close collaboration.

The Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council also recognised that cricket needs to be played in the true spirit of the game and enjoyed by all participants, in a competitive and healthy environment. The Council took proactive steps in conjunction with the local cricket bodies to achieve this objective. An emphasis on respect for the opposition, the umpires and the laws of the game, ie. the *spirit of cricket*, has now been incorporated in the preamble to the MCC Laws of Cricket by the world's governing body.

One of the objectives was to accelerate the 'career paths' of our outstanding young cricketers by the earlier identification of players with talent and commitment, in order to provide high level coaching and development opportunities for these players. It was hoped that many of these players would successfully progress through the HK&HDCA Shield junior representative teams; play Green Shield and Grade Cricket with Northern District CC; or A Grade within the HK&HDCA Senior Competition.

It is important that HK&HDCA maintains close ties with its local grade club, Northern District CC at Waitara, as our Association is the main feeder of talented players to grade cricket. NDCC officials have regularly attended Ross Turner Cup and/or Glenn Hourigan Cup matches since their inception on talent scouting missions. The positive efforts of HKHDCCA (Coaches' Association) in conducting junior coaching clinics in the school holidays in conjunction with NDCC is further fostering a strong link with our local grade club.

Improving the pathway from the HK&HDCA Northern Knights representative teams to NDCC's U/16 Green Shield squad is an important strategy. Grade clubs are on the look out to identify even younger talented cricketers these days to add to their academy training squads, so it is quite possible that the leading performers in today's Glenn Hourigan Cup match will be noted by NDCC, particularly as we have raised the age group to U/13 this year (it was previously an U/12 internal representative match).

The Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup matches were the brainchild of Tom Richmond, OAM, Patron & Life Member of HK&HDCA, who has passed the baton after 11 years of sterling service to Bruce Wood, President of HKHDCCA. It is quite appropriate that our Coaches' Association has taken over the running of these important representative fixtures, as they are all about junior development.

Today's Glenn Hourigan Cup (50 over) match brings together the leading U/13, U/12 & U/11 players in the district in teams which roughly represent the eastern and western halves of the Association. The teams have been selected on the basis of performances throughout the season, mainly in representative cricket, however outstanding form in club cricket and the recent preliminary Glenn Hourigan Cup Twenty/20 matches (a new initiative this year) was also taken into account.

The players' shirts have been kindly provided by our generous sponsor, Triforce Sports Pty Ltd. A special thank you to Abbas Aly for this gesture. I'm sure all the players and spectators will thoroughly enjoy today's exciting contest.



### Glenn Hourigan

(HK&HDCA Life Member)

Glenn Hourigan was the Association's Representative Secretary from 1988 to 2001. During that period HK&HDCA won the U/19 Durham Shield twice, the Martin Shield, the U/15 Weblin Shield and the Girls' U/14 representative competition.

Glenn's connection with the Association began when his son was playing, but continued long afterwards. His contribution to rep. cricket within our Association was enormous, covering our participation in all NSWDCA Shield competitions. He also championed the entry of "development" teams in the IDCA competitions (now known as President's Cup).

Glenn used to be involved in numerous coaching initiatives, including the significant *Northern Cricket* programs that led the way several years ago. He contributed massively to organising competent coaching and management of our inter-district representative teams. He was also an enthusiastic supporter of the girls' cricket competitions that were emerging at the time.

Glenn has always been concerned about the need for all players to be given the maximum of opportunity and a "fair go", both in representative selection trials and in matches. He holds the view that if we can do this for the young players, the rest is up to them. He always had a soft spot for the "battler" and encouraged cricket development at all levels of ability.

Glenn is a person who speaks his mind and who gives credit where it is due. He has been a constant voice demanding the development of young players as a means of securing the future of this great game of ours. He sees cricket as part of the Australian way of life and a basic right in this country for all young people.

No-one has ever taken greater pride in our Association or worked harder for its representative teams than Glenn, who was inducted as a Life Member of HK&HDCA in 1997.

Glenn continues to take a keen interest in cricket and we are delighted that he and his wife Margaret will be in attendance at today's match. It is always terrific to see them back at HK&HDCA events.

### What is HKHDCCA?

The Hornsby, Ku-ring-gai & Hills District Cricket Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) was established in 2010 and is responsible for:

- enhancing the ongoing development of our accredited coaches;
- raising the profile of coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association;
- facilitating a future pathway for club and representative coaches:
- providing professional coaching opportunities at our Junior Coaching Clinics with NDCC;
- co-ordinating the annual Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup representative fixtures;
- enabling the Association to maintain a record of all Level 1 and 2 accredited coaches.

**Bruce Wood** is performing the role of HKHDCCA President for the 2010-11 cricket season, supported by **Mark Rushton** as Vice-President, **Mike Burgin** as Secretary, and **David Bennett** as Treasurer (all Level 2 coaches).

HKHDCCA has been honoured by **Ross Turner** accepting the role of Patron. Ross played his early cricket with Pennant Hills CC in the HK&HDCA competition and went on to captain Northern District First Grade to two premierships. In later years, Ross worked for Cricket NSW, pioneering development activities, before going to London to work on cricket development for the ICC. Currently he is involved in the development of cricket in overseas countries such as China, Malaysia, Afghanistan and India. Ross has made a huge contribution to cricket on a worldwide basis, but is still keen to help out with cricket development in our local district. In accepting the appointment of HKHDCCA Patron, Ross wrote "I welcome the prospect of working with you and the executive of the Coaches' Association to undertake key initiatives that will lead to the highest quality coaching, which in turn, will serve to develop the standard and enjoyment levels of players throughout the Association."

The Association's annual showcase U/15 representative match (Ross Turner Cup) is named in his honour.

**Rod Hokin** is the HKHDCCA Coaching Co-ordinator (Head Coach), which is another key role for the Coaches' Association. Rod plays First Grade for Northern District CC and is a talented and vastly experienced coach. Rod spent the off-season in 2010 playing professional cricket and coaching in Ireland, UK. He is assisting Bruce Wood in developing a Centre of Excellence within HK&HDCA to effectively accelerate the development of accredited coaches.

HKHDCCA is working in partnership with Northern District CC to promote and run junior Coaching Clinics during the September/October and January school holidays. The first of these Clinics took place in September 2010 at Waitara Oval, which was followed by two more Clinics in January 2011 at Waitara Oval and Kenthurst Park. The written evaluations from the parents were excellent, with many parents expressing their gratitude at the overall coaching ratio of approximately 1:6, which provides more individualised coaching opportunities.

The clinics included video analysis of the bowlers' actions; specific coaching on batting, bowling and fielding skills (and wicket-keeping drills where applicable); training in the nets (including turf nets at Waitara); batting against a bowling machine (at Kenthurst); a wide range of coaching drills and games to reinforce the cricket skills learnt and to develop team work; plus a Cricket 'Olympics' event and Super Sixes competitions.

The accredited coaches engaged at the clinics included Rod Hokin (Head Coach), Bruce Wood (Co-ordinator), Jono Whealing, Dave Lowery, Nick Cheadle, Andrew Lowe, Irfan Baig, Tim Matson, Jamie Matson, Mike Burgin and Justin Epthorp. We were fortunate to have Ross Turner as a special guest coach at our Waitara Oval clinic in January 2011. Following the clinic, Ross sent this correspondence to Bruce Wood: "A short note to extend congratulations to you for your outstanding efforts in coordinating the HKHDCCA — Northern District Cricket Club Coaching Program across the past week. I commend you and Rod Hokin for bringing it all together in fine style. Northern District and HKHDCCA are to be commended on their joint initiative to promote and develop the game across Sydney's north-west region. Congratulations are also offered to the coaches who worked in committed and enthusiastic fashion."

The next HKHDCCA / NDCC cricket clinics will take place during the Sept./Oct. 2011 school holidays. Enquiries can be directed to Bruce Wood, bruce.wood@hkhdca.com.au, Ph. 0412 688 629.

HKHDCCA is also providing coaching opportunities for some outstanding young coaches, with **Josh Miller**, **Daniel Anderson**, **Nathan Tanner** & **James Madden** being appointed to coach teams in the Glenn Hourigan Cup competition in 2011. This is an exciting new direction for coaching within HK&HDCA, which will also strengthen our band of coaches in charge of our junior *Northern Knights* representative teams in future years.
