# Glenn Hourigan

(HK&HDCA Life Member)

The Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) contest began in 2003-04 following the success of the annual U/15 Ross Turner Cup (RTC) fixture, which was inaugurated in 1998-99 to promote an opportunity for our best junior players to appear in a 'showcase' game of high level representative standard cricket. The GHC was initially an U/12 contest, but was changed to U/13 in 2011.

The RTC and GHC matches were the 'brainchild' of Tom Richmond OAM, who passed the responsibility after 12 years of sterling service to



Bruce Wood, President of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA), in 2010-11. Bruce has maintained the fine tradition and appointed some impressive young RTC and GHC coaches.

Glenn Hourigan (pictured above) was the Association's Representative Secretary from 1988 to 2001. During that period, HK&HDCA won the U/19 Durham Shield twice, the Martin Shield, the U/15 Weblin Shield and the Girls' U/14 representative competition. Glenn's connection with the Association began when his son was playing, however continued long afterwards. His contribution to rep. cricket within our Association was enormous, covering our participation in all NSWDCA Shield competitions. He also championed the entry of 'development' representative teams in the IDCA competitions.

Glenn used to be involved in numerous coaching initiatives, including the significant *Northern Cricket* programs that led the way many years ago. He contributed massively to organising competent coaching and management of our inter-district representative teams. He was also an enthusiastic supporter of the girls' cricket competitions that were emerging at the time.

Glenn has always been concerned about the need for all players to be given the maximum of opportunity and a "fair go", both in representative selection trials and in matches. He holds the view that if we can do this for the young players, the rest is up to them. He always had a soft spot for the "battler" and encouraged cricket development at all levels of ability. Glenn has been a constant voice for the development of young players as a means of securing the future of this great game of ours. He sees cricket as part of the Australian way of life and a basic right in this country for all young people.

No-one has ever taken greater pride in our Association or worked harder for its representative teams than Glenn, who was inducted as HK&HDCA's 38<sup>th</sup> Life Member in 1997. Glenn continues to take a keen interest in cricket, in particular, the annual GHC match. We are pleased that Glenn and his wife Margaret were able to attend this year's GHC match to congratulate the selected players and pass on some valuable advice and encouragement.

#### Umpires for Glenn Hourigan Cup match in 2019-20

Alf James OAM is a Life Member of HK&HDCA and the NSWDCA, and was President of HK&HDCA for 22 years (1980 – 2002). He holds the distinction of being the only player in HK&HDCA history to score over 10,000 runs and take in excess of 1,000 wickets in the local Senior Competition. In 2013-14, he completed his Jubilee season, an incredible 50 consecutive years playing in the HK&HDCA Senior Competition. The HK&HDCA C3 Grade premiership perpetual trophy is named in his honour. Alf represents NSW in the Over 70s cricket team that competes in the national championships. Alf has umpired over 160 matches for HK&HDCA, including the past nine GHC matches since 2011-12.

Jason Fletcher (pictured – left of photo) commenced

umpiring in 2016 and has so far recorded just over 100 matches for HK&HDCA. He has previously served on the Executive Committee of the Umpires' Association (HKHDCUA) and continues to assist when required, especially on the social side. Jason enjoyed playing cricket for many years and is pleased to be putting back into the game that he loves. He understands the game well and adopts a practical approach to his umpiring, which has seen him climb up the standings within the Umpires' Association to earn some higher grade appointments. Jason's family has known the Hourigan family for many years, so these GHC matches are a highlight for Jason.

# Coaches' Association

The **Coaches' Association** (HKHDCCA) is a leading *not-for-profit* cricket coaching organisation responsible for recruiting and accrediting young coaches from within HK&HDCA and north-western Sydney; and conducting cricket clinics during the school holidays and development programs in the off-season. HKHDCCA designs and implements coaching programs aimed at increasing the cricket participation, skills and enjoyment of boys and girls aged 5-15, including beginners, club players, rep. standard players, and children with special needs.

HKHDCCA aims to continue to expand its subsidised (or free) coaching programs to a wider cross-section of the community, many of whom have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket, including disadvantaged groups, children from non-English speaking communities, and children with special needs. The successful implementation of these challenging initiatives should assist in facilitating sporting, cultural and social inclusion for these communities, while also promoting healthy, active lifestyles and increasing the participation rate in cricket in NSW. Responsibilities include:

- raising the profile of coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association;
- promoting the objective that all club and representative coaches attain the Cricket Australia Community (Level 1) accreditation as a minimum (preferably Level 2 for representative Shield team coaches);
- conducting an annual Community (Level 1) accredited coaching course for HK&HDCA and NDCC members.
- organising cricket clinics at Waitara, West Pennant Hills, Dundas and/or Normanhurst, in partnership with Northern District CC, during the September / October and January school holidays for players aged 6 14;
- conducting annual off-season Rising Stars Coaching Program(s) for players aged U/9 U/15 of all standards, including a junior development program designed to fast-track their transition from soft to hard ball cricket;
- representing the Coaches' Association on all cricket coaching matters at the HK&HDCA Council and Executive Meetings (the President of the Coaches' Association is a delegate on the HK&HDCA Executive Committee);
- providing active Coaches' Association members with professional coaching opportunities at our junior cricket clinics and our off-season junior development programs;
- co-ordinating the annual U/15 Ross Turner Cup (RTC) and U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) 'showcase' intra-Association representative fixtures, including the preliminary GHC T20 matches, in September each year;
- identifying potential young coaches and providing RTC and GHC coaching roles and other opportunities;
- recognising excellence in cricket coaching at club, representative or Coaches' Association levels through our HKHDCCA Coach of Year award (Bruce Wood Cup);
- arranging a HKHDCCA / NDCC overseas rep. cricket tour (U/15 age group) every two years (since 2015);
- providing financial assistance to a limited number of HKHDCCA candidates nominated to attend a Cricket NSW
  accredited coaching course (Levels 2 or 3), as Community (Level 1) courses are now free;
- increasing the participation of girls in cricket, in consultation with Cricket NSW (Sydney Sixers) and the HK&HDCA Girls Cricket Co-ordinator, through targeted coaching programs and liaison with schools and clubs;
- · conducting a free Beginners session, teaching cricket fundamentals to 'first time' players each year;
- assisting clubs by running some coaching sessions and demonstrating coaching drills to new club coaches, and providing a mentor service to coaches as required, especially new or young coaches seeking guidance;
- holding two free annual clinics each year for Blowfly cricketers (children with special needs) in January and September / October, plus ad-hoc coaching on Saturdays, depending on the availability of coaches;
- enhancing the development of accredited coaches and facilitating a future pathway for club and rep. coaches;
- arranging Insurance for HKHDCCA and the annual incorporated association return to NSW Fair Trading;
- seeking corporate sponsorship and Government Grant opportunities to provide additional funding to expand and further subsidise our coaching programs, and purchase additional equipment as required;
- ensuring that all coaches aged 18 and over have a current Working with Children Check 5-year clearance;
- promoting our activities and coaching programs via the HK&HDCA website and social media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn);
- aiming to provide cricket coaching for community groups from non-English speaking backgrounds who have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket in Sydney.

**Bruce Wood** has performed the role of President of the Coaches' Association since 2010-11 and is supported by **Daniel Wood** (Vice-President), **Josh Miller** (Secretary), **Rod Hokin** (Head Coach), and **Nick Miller** (Treasurer).
