ROLE, FUNCTIONS AND OBJECTIVES

The **Coaches' Association** (HKHDCCA) is a leading cricket coaching organisation responsible for recruiting and accrediting young coaches from within HK&HDCA and north-western Sydney; and conducting junior cricket clinics during the school holidays and development programs in the off-season. HKHDCCA designs and implements coaching programs aimed at increasing the cricket participation, skills and enjoyment of boys and girls aged 5 – 15, including beginners, club players, representative standard players, and children with special needs.

We have experienced significant growth since our inception in 2010 and aim to continue to expand our subsidised (or free) coaching programs to a wider cross-section of the community, many of whom have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket, including disadvantaged groups, children from non-English speaking communities, and children with special needs. We also strongly support the growth of Girls' cricket at grassroots level. The successful implementation of these initiatives assists in facilitating sporting, cultural and social inclusion for these community groups, while also promoting healthy, active lifestyles, and increasing the participation rate in cricket in NSW.

Responsibilities include:

- raising the profile of cricket coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association;
- promoting the objective that all club and representative coaches attain the Cricket Australia Community (Level 1) accreditation as a minimum (preferably Level 2 for representative Shield team coaches);
- enhancing the development of accredited coaches and facilitating a future pathway for club and rep. coaches;
- organising an annual Community (Level 1) accredited coaching course for HK&HDCA and NDCC members.
- organising cricket clinics for players aged 6 – 14 at Waitara, Normanhurst, West Pennant Hills, Hornsby and/or Dundas, in partnership with Northern District CC, during the January, April and Sept. / October school holidays;
- representing the Coaches' Association on all cricket coaching matters at the HK&HDCA Council and Executive Meetings (the President of the Coaches' Association is a delegate on the Executive Committee);
- providing active Coaches' Association members with professional coaching opportunities at our junior cricket clinics and off-season junior development programs;
- co-ordinating the annual HK&HDCA U/15 Ross Turner Cup (RTC) and U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) 'showcase' intra-Association representative fixtures;
- identifying potential outstanding young coaches; providing RTC & GHC coaching roles and other opportunities;
- recognising excellence in cricket coaching at club, representative or Coaches' Association levels through our HKHDCCA *Coach of the Year* award (Bruce Wood Cup);
- arranging a HKHDCCA / NDCC representative cricket tour (U/15 age group) every two years (since 2015);
- holding two free annual clinics each year for Blowfly Cricket (children with special needs) in January and September / October, plus ad-hoc coaching at other programs, depending on the availability of coaches; providing volunteer services at Blowfly Cricket fund-raising events and other programs;
- increasing the participation of girls in cricket, in consultation with Cricket NSW (Sydney Sixers) and the HK&HDCA Girls Cricket Co-ordinator, through targeted coaching programs and liaison with schools and clubs;
- conducting off-season Rising Stars Development Programs, depending on demand and availability of venues;
- providing financial assistance to a limited number of HKHDCCA candidates nominated to attend a Cricket NSW accredited coaching course (Levels 2 or 3), as Community (Level 1) courses are now free;
- conducting a free Beginners session, teaching cricket fundamentals to 'first time' players each year;
- assisting clubs by running some coaching sessions and demonstrating coaching drills to new club coaches;
- providing a mentor service to coaches as required, especially new or young coaches seeking guidance;
- arranging Insurance for HKHDCCA and the annual incorporated association return to NSW Fair Trading;
- seeking corporate sponsorship and Government Grant opportunities to provide additional funding to expand and further subsidise our coaching programs, and purchase additional equipment as required;
- ensuring that all coaches aged 18 and over have a current *Working with Children* Check 5-year clearance;
- promoting our activities and coaching programs via the HK&HDCA website and the Coaches' Association's social media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn);
- assisting the HK&HDCA Rep. Secretary with coaching matters relating to the representative program;
- aiming to provide cricket coaching for community groups from non-English speaking backgrounds who have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket in Sydney.



PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Bruce Wood)

The Coaches' Association enjoyed another productive year in 2020-21, as outlined in this annual report. Covid-19 had an impact on our activities and forced the cancellation of our off-season Rising Stars program in Winter 2020.

Accredited coaches – Our Head Coach, Rod Hokin, has a High Performance (Level 3) accreditation, plus we have 9 Representative (Level 2) coaches and 20 Community (Level 1) coaches, many of whom are top NDCC players.

School holiday junior cricket clinics (in partnership with Northern District CC) – The Coaches' Association held six junior cricket clinics during the October 2020, January 2021 and April 2021 school holidays, 5 at Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara; and one at Normanhurst Oval. A total of 425 children attended the clinics, which averaged 71 per clinic. HKHDCCA presented its prestigious Phillip Hughes Medal at each school holiday clinic to recognise outstanding sportsmanship, teamwork, enthusiasm, performance and spirit of cricket. HKHDCCA has a Government-approved Covid-19 Safety Plan, which was enacted at each program in 2020-21.

RTC and GHC – The Coaches' Association again co-ordinated the annual Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup 'showcase' matches on Sunday, 7 February 2021. HKHDCCA appointed two impressive RTC coaches – Cooper Davenport and Corey Miller; plus two enthusiastic GHC coaches – Daniel Wood and Blake Davenport.

Life Membership – The Coaches' Association was pleased to induct another very deserving Life Member in 2020-21 – congratulations to Ross Turner.

Coaching awards – Congratulations to Braden Cheng from HKHDCCA for winning the *Coach of the Year* award (Bruce Wood Cup) in 2020-21. The HKHDCCA President's Award was won by Daniel Wood, and the Rookie Coach Award was won by Corey Miller. Refer to award announcements - *Stump to Stump* - bit.ly/S2S-CA-awards

Cricket NSW / Sydney Sixers / HK&HDCA Girls Master Blaster hubs – The Coaches' Association is always keen to actively promote Girls cricket and partnered with Cricket NSW and the Sydney Sixers in two Girls-only junior clinics, and two HK&HDCA Master Blaster Girls programs at Thornleigh; and also supplied coaches for the Women's social cricket sessions run by Daniel Anderson on Wednesday evenings at MTO, Waitara.

Blowfly Cricket – HKHDCCA held free coaching sessions on 30 September 2020 and 13 January 2021 for Blowfly Cricket, a wonderful organisation led by Mark Rushton, Jordan Jones and Marnie Nissen, that provides children with special needs the opportunity to play a hybrid form of cricket and participate in community activities.

Sponsorship – The Coaches' Association's strong partnership with Parramatta Leagues Club continued for a sixth year in 2020-21. We sincerely thank the club for its generous support of our youth development programs.

Good Sports – The Coaches' Association attained Level 3 accreditation under the Good Sports Program.

Formal coaching course – HKHDCCA liaised with Cricket NSW and helped to organise and promote a Community (Level 1) accredited cricket coaching course on Sunday, 13 December 2020 at Barker College, Hornsby.

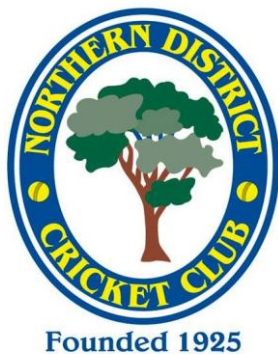
Insurance – The Coaches' Association has its own Public and Products Liability Insurance with Marsh / JLT – our Policy number for 2020-21 was 20503551494.

HKHDCCA / NDCC Under 15 tour – The International Cricket Academy League (ICAL) tournament on the Sunshine Coast, Queensland, was cancelled due to COVID-19 just a week before the scheduled start in July 2021.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY JUNIOR CRICKET CLINICS

(in partnership with
Northern District CC)



The Coaches' Association conducted six successful cricket clinics during the school holidays in 2020-21, including our first ever clinic in April (Autumn holidays):

• Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara	30 Sept. & 1 Oct. 2020	– 56 children and 10 coaches attended;
• Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara	6 – 7 October 2020	– 57 children and 11 coaches;
• Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara	5 – 6 January 2021	– 77 children and 12 coaches;
• Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara	13 – 14 January 2021	– 83 children and 13 coaches;
• Normanhurst Oval	20 – 21 January 2021	– 70 children and 11 coaches;
• Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara	7 – 8 April 2021	– 82 children and 12 coaches.

A total of **425** children attended the six clinics, which averaged an impressive **71** boys and girls per clinic. The clinics cater for all cricket standards from beginners to representative standard players and the players (aged between 5 and 14) receive plenty of group and individual coaching from experienced coaches, many of whom have played **First** and **Second** Grade men's and women's cricket (as highlighted below).

A total of **25** coaches attended the six clinics – **Rod Hokin** (Head Coach) (High Performance Level 3 accredited); **Josh Miller**, **Tom Felton**, **Ross Pawson** (acting Head Coaches), **Bruce Wood** (Co-ordinator), **Nick Miller**, **Braden Cheng**, **Joe Hiley**, **Aaron Crofts** & **Harrison Norrell** (Representative Level 2 accredited); plus **John Anderson**, **Jamie McEvoy**, **Corey Miller**, **Lachlan Shaw**, **Hame Fullagar**, **Jayden Camp**, **Mackenzie Carrall**, **Gian Gill**, **Dylan Bish**, **Will McCarroll**, **Sean McAllister**, **Dani Chivers**, **Jack Nati** (Community Level 1 accredited); and **Will McFadden** & **Henry Gross** (Assistant Coaches). The coaches did a terrific job, helping the youngsters develop their skills through a range of coaching drills, video analysis and games-based activities.

The Coaches' Association held a 'Master Class' session at each school holiday clinic to inspire the children and to demonstrate their coaches' cricket skills. The 'Master Class' batsmen featured at our 2020-21 clinics were **Hame Fullagar** and **Lachy Shaw** (right). The clinics included a wide range of activities for the boys and girls, including video analysis of the bowlers' actions. The players were placed in small groups in line with their age, ability and friendship groups, and received specialist coaching on defensive and aggressive batting, shot selection, pace and spin bowling, catching,



throwing, wicket-keeping skills; game-awareness / tactics, match preparation, fitness and training in the nets (astro and turf). The players also benefited from a variety of age-specific coaching drills, concluding with games on the oval to reinforce the cricket skills learnt, develop team work and introduce a competitive but friendly element to the games.

The Coaches' Association presented a major award (**Phillip Hughes Medal**) at each clinic to recognise outstanding sportsmanship, teamwork, enthusiasm, performance and spirit of cricket. The winners in 2020-21 were: **Aanya Siingh, Nandha Sajish, Joe Newman, Beau Goodall, Charlie Egan** and **Brendan Westwood** (see pages 10 – 11).

We thank all the HK&HDCA affiliated clubs for their strong support in promoting these popular clinics amongst their junior teams. 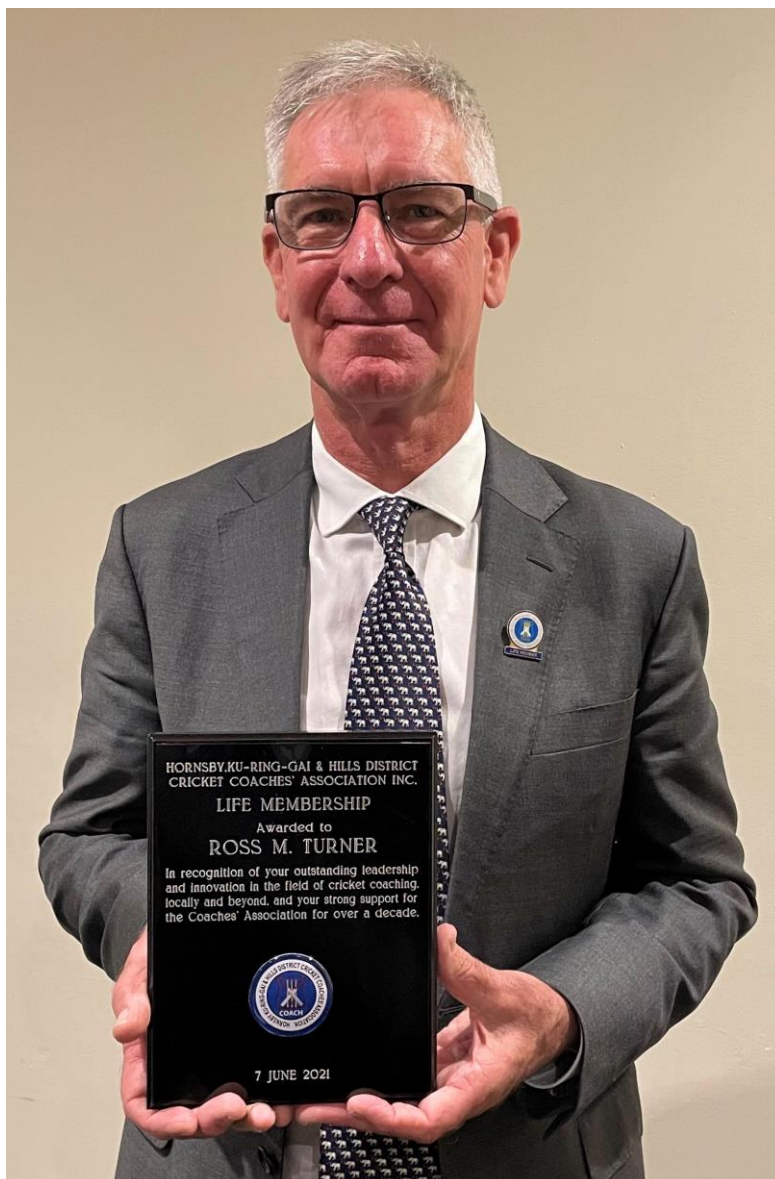

Relevant coaching / committee positions (past and present) held by individual being nominated

- September 1989: Development Manager (inaugural appointment), NSW Cricket Association, which included a successful pilot of the Kanga Cricket program in HK&HDCA, which spread nationally.
- December 1993: Founder of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council (NMCC) in north-western Sydney, which included HK&HDCA and surrounding cricket associations, NDCC and schools; pioneered grassroots cricket coaching for hundreds of children; coordinated pre-season coaching for the Association.
- July 1994: Inducted as 27th Life Member of Northern District CC.
- 1998: Global Development Manager (inaugural appointment), International Cricket Council (ICC), based at Lords; facilitated the development of cricket in nations such as Bangladesh, Nepal, China, Malaysia, Kenya, Zimbabwe, Uganda, Afghanistan, Ireland, Canada, Denmark and Netherlands.
- 1998-99: HK&HDCA inaugurated annual U/15 Ross Turner Cup (RTC) 'showcase' representative match.
- 2000-05: General Manager, Game Development, Cricket Australia, which included initiatives to promote cricket for males & females in clubs and schools, coach development, access to cricket for first nations peoples, and establishment of the National Cricket Centre in Brisbane.
- 2005-10: International Development Manager, Cricket Australia, which included the delivery of administrative, coaching, umpiring and facility-related services to Test and non-Test nations such as India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and the Asian Cricket Council (ACC).
- 2010-11 – current: Patron of HK&HDCA and Patron of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA).
- 2011: Director of National Cricket Academy, Bangladesh; including setting up and delivery of the inaugural academy program at Mirpur Stadium, Dhaka.
- 2015: Consultant to the Bangladesh Cricket Board; formulated strategic plan for Bangladesh cricket and implementation of national high performance and coaching programs.
- 2013 – current: Director of Cricket, Teacher and Mentor at Newington College, Stanmore; also, AAGPS Cricket Convenor.



Significant coaching / cricket community achievements of individual being nominated

- Founder of Kanga Cricket in Australia, with the initial pilot program run in HK&HDCA. Alf James OAM wrote:
In 1984 Peter Spence was appointed Development Manager by the A.C.B. with the responsibility to introduce "Kanga Cricket" throughout Australia. It took some time for the concept to "get off the ground" in N.S.W. until 1992 when Ross Turner, the newly appointed (and first) Development Manager for the N.S.W.C.A., encouraged the H.K.C.A. (later expanded to HK&HDCA) to run a "pilot" program. Ross trained 30 volunteers who successfully completed the level "O" course designed for the purpose. The program was launched at five centres in the district and attracted 280 boys and girls aged 5 to 8. The Association was used as a model for the whole of the State and 50 of our players put on an exhibition on the S.C.G. in January 1993 during the Test Match between Australia and Pakistan. In 1993-94 there were 700 Kanga players trained by an army of coaches under Jim Barrett (later N.D.C.C. President) as Kanga Co-ordinator and nine Kanga Ground Co-ordinators.
- Founder of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council (NMCC) in north-western Sydney. Alf James OAM wrote:
The formation of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council on 20 December 1993, on the initiative of Ross Turner and under the Chairmanship of Tom Richmond, gave a great boost to coaching in the district. The foundation members were Pennant Hills and Epping Shires, N.D.C.C., Northern Districts C.A., the H.K.C.A. (HK&HDCA) and representatives of secondary and primary schools. Numerous coaching schemes were conducted under its banner over the next decade including: the provision by N.D.C.C. of coaches for our representative teams; pre-season coaching clinics for all players under John Whelan of N.D.C.C; pre-season training by Ross Turner, Matthew Phelps and John Hopkins for representative players; and "Winter Spin" and "Emerging Bluegum" projects conducted by the ubiquitous Tom Richmond.
- Most successful Captain in Northern District CC history with two first grade premierships in 1985-86 & 1986-87. Voted as Captain of the Year by the Sydney Cricket Association on three occasions. In all grades, Ross scored 9,008 runs and took 153 wickets. His first-grade career spanned from 1976 to 1993, scoring 5,302 runs at an average of 29.45 including 3 centuries and 29 half centuries.
- During the 1990s, Ross pioneered Cricket NSW's development programs, after which he joined the ICC to head up global Cricket development as part of a strategy to expand the game to new markets. Ross played a key role in cricket development activities in Bangladesh, China, Malaysia, Afghanistan and India.
- Ross worked in cricket with international, national and state organisations for 25 years. In his role as the ICC Global Development Manager, he witnessed cricket evolve from cottage industry to mainstream entity [driven principally by India]. He was involved in senior management positions in cricket and business development. The scope of work included a start-up of cricket in China; involvement in the formative stages of cricket's anti-corruption strategy; development of cricket in sub-Saharan Africa; plus, advocacy and development of women's cricket. The clear vision was to make the game accessible to people of all ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- Ross has maintained an involvement in coaching and coach education overseas with occasional forays to India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh. In the early 2000s, Cricket Australia established a compact with the Asian Cricket Council, which resulted in a coach accreditation scheme for all Asian cricket nations. Coach accreditation programs were delivered Asia-wide to improve the quality of coaching, and in turn, playing standards in Test and non-Test nations.
- In a national context, Ross implemented cricket initiatives for first peoples, created structures and promoted women's cricket, revised coaching programs, and established a national club cricket insurance scheme. Among his achievements (over a decade) with Cricket Australia, Ross was responsible for setting up the Cricket Centre of Excellence in Brisbane, and co-ordinated the national talent program.
- Ross obtained the Cricket Australia (Level 3) Coach Accreditation in 1991 and later acquired Certificate IV Training & Assessment accreditation. In 2007 & 2010, Ross delivered Level 3 Coach Accreditation Courses for the Asian Cricket Council, plus many Level 1 & 2 Coach Certificate Courses. From 2005 – 2019, Ross oversaw the delivery of Level 3 and Level Coach 4 Certificates for and on behalf of the Pakistan Cricket Board.
- The RTC annual event was named in his honour in 1998-99, as Ross was one of HK&HDCA's most famous products. As a young player, Ross was a brilliant all-rounder who bowled leg-spin, batted beautifully (left-handed) and was without peer in the field. He played for Pennant Hills CC and HK&HDCA rep. teams. In HK&HDCA junior cricket, Ross scored 2,045 runs and took 268 wickets. Ross has been a terrific inspiration for this special event – refer to the RTC Program for 2020-21: bit.ly/RTC-7-Feb-21

HK&HDCA's showcase junior representative match called the Ross Turner Cup (RTC) has been held since 1998-99 and features the outstanding players in our district from the U/15 age group and below. The annual contest was originated by **Tom Richmond** OAM, Life Member of Northern District CC, HK&HDCA and the Coaches' Association, who passed the responsibility to **Bruce Wood**, President, Coaches' Association, in 2010-11.

One of the objectives of the RTC fixtures was the early identification of players with talent and commitment, in order to provide high level coaching and development opportunities for these players. It was hoped that many of them would successfully progress through the HK&HDCA Shield junior representative teams; play AW Green Shield and Grade Cricket with Northern District CC; or A Grade within the HK&HDCA Senior Competition.

The Cup is named in honour of **Ross Turner**, one of our Association's finest products, who became Northern District's most successful captain, winning two First Grade premierships. Ross played for Pennant Hills CC and NDs before working for Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia, pioneering development activities. He later worked for the International Cricket Council (ICC) in emerging cricket nations, such as Bangladesh, China, Malaysia and Afghanistan. He is now the Director of Cricket at Newington College and the Convenor of GPS cricket in Sydney.

HK&HDCA thanks its sponsor, Kookaburra Sport (Cameron Eve), for supplying the match balls, stumps, and the Player of the Match awards. UMPIRES FOR ROSS TURNER CUP MATCH – 2020-21

Bruce Wood is a Life Member and Executive Member of HK&HDCA; President (and Life Member) of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA); Hon. Umpires' Co-ordinator for the Associated Schools of NSW (CAS); and the RTC / GHC Convenor since 2010-11. Bruce was recognised by Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia as the *Community Match Official of the Year* at the national 'A Sport For All' Awards in May 2020. He has umpired over 300 club and/or representative matches for HKHDCUA since 2001-02, and more than 600 matches in all competitions. Bruce has umpired 15 RTC fixtures; 17 NSWDCA Shield Finals; two Cricket NSW U14 State Challenge Finals (SCG in 2013, and Bradman Oval, Bowral in 2015). He has umpired overseas in Sri Lanka in 2015, Barbados in 2017 and India in 2019 on the Coaches' Association / Northern District CC U/15 representative cricket tours. Bruce jointly holds (with Bryan Whitlock – 178 no) the HK&HDCA record for the highest partnership for the 5th wicket in any Senior grade – 320* runs set in 2000-01 for Normanhurst-Warrawee CC at Normanhurst Oval (Bruce scored 138 no). He is also a Life Member of Normanhurst-Warrawee CC and Barker CC.



Scott Reid is the Executive Officer (and Life Member) of HK&HDCA; and the former President of the Umpires' Association (HKHDCUA). He has umpired 180 matches for HKHDCUA since 1998-99, including two NSWDCA Shield Finals, and the Final of the NSW Schools Championship Cup in November 2019. Scott is in his 32nd season as a player for Beecroft CC in the HK&HDCA competitions, starting in the U/16s back in 1985-86. He served 10 seasons on both the Association's Executive and Senior Competition Committee between 1994-95 to 2004-05. Scott jointly holds (with Adam Nash – 329) the HK&HDCA record for the highest partnership for any wicket in any Senior grade – 7th wicket, 427 runs in the B Reserve Grade Final at Parklands Oval in 1990-91 (Scott scored 212 no in a team total of 725). Scott has scored approximately 9,000 runs in senior cricket, including six centuries and 45 half-centuries; won four Association batting awards, and six HK&HDCA premierships.

Girls Master Blaster Programs at Thornleigh Oval in 2020-21 (Co-ordinator – Dani Chivers)

In Term 4, 2020 and Term 1, 2021, two Girls-only cricket programs were held on Friday nights at Thornleigh Oval. The program was organised by **Daniel Anderson**, a former senior coach with HKHDCCA (Coaches' Association), who now works for Cricket NSW. HKHDCCA coach, **Dani Chivers**, did a terrific job as Program Co-ordinator at the Thornleigh Hub of these Master Blaster Girls Programs in 2020-21 (12 sessions).

The programs are designed to increase the participation of girls in cricket. The Coaches' Association was pleased to support **Eternity Aid** <https://www.eternityaid.org.au/> with a special cricket clinic at Bourke Public School, which has over 200 students, 78% of which are of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent.

Matt Wright, who started his cricket coaching with HKHDCCA in 2015, is a volunteer for Eternity Aid, an organisation which began in 2005 with the aim of providing educational and life skills programs for Aboriginal youth, particularly in Bourke in far north-western NSW. Matt (pictured at right spin bowling in NSW Premier Cricket First Grade for Gordon DCC), submitted a brief report (see below).



On 4 June 2021, I had the pleasure of running a cricket clinic in Bourke on behalf of Eternity Aid. It was a small but enjoyable session for approximately 20 local kids. There was a wide range in ages and skill levels, predominantly primary school indigenous boys and girls. The cricket clinic was held at the local Davidson Oval after school, in time for many of the kids we visited at the schools during the day to come down and join the fun.



We started the session with some basic catching drills before progressing onto a popular batting drill. Everyone worked on their grip, watching the ball and playing straight. When we moved onto bowling, we focused on wrist position and the front arm, which resulted in significant improvement by everyone. Finally, to put our skills into practice, we played a game of cricket. The teamwork and communication shown by the players was terrific – see photos: bit.ly/EA-Bourke-4-6-21

I was thrilled to see how much improvement each player made over the course of a couple of hours, but even more pleased that everyone had great fun during the session. The clinic would not have been possible without the Coaches' Association who loaned

us the majority of the equipment for the session – everyone involved was grateful for their generosity. Thanks to Bruce Wood (President), plus all the coaches and administrators involved in the Coaches' Association, many of whom were my coaches as a junior player and also trained me when I first became an accredited cricket coach.

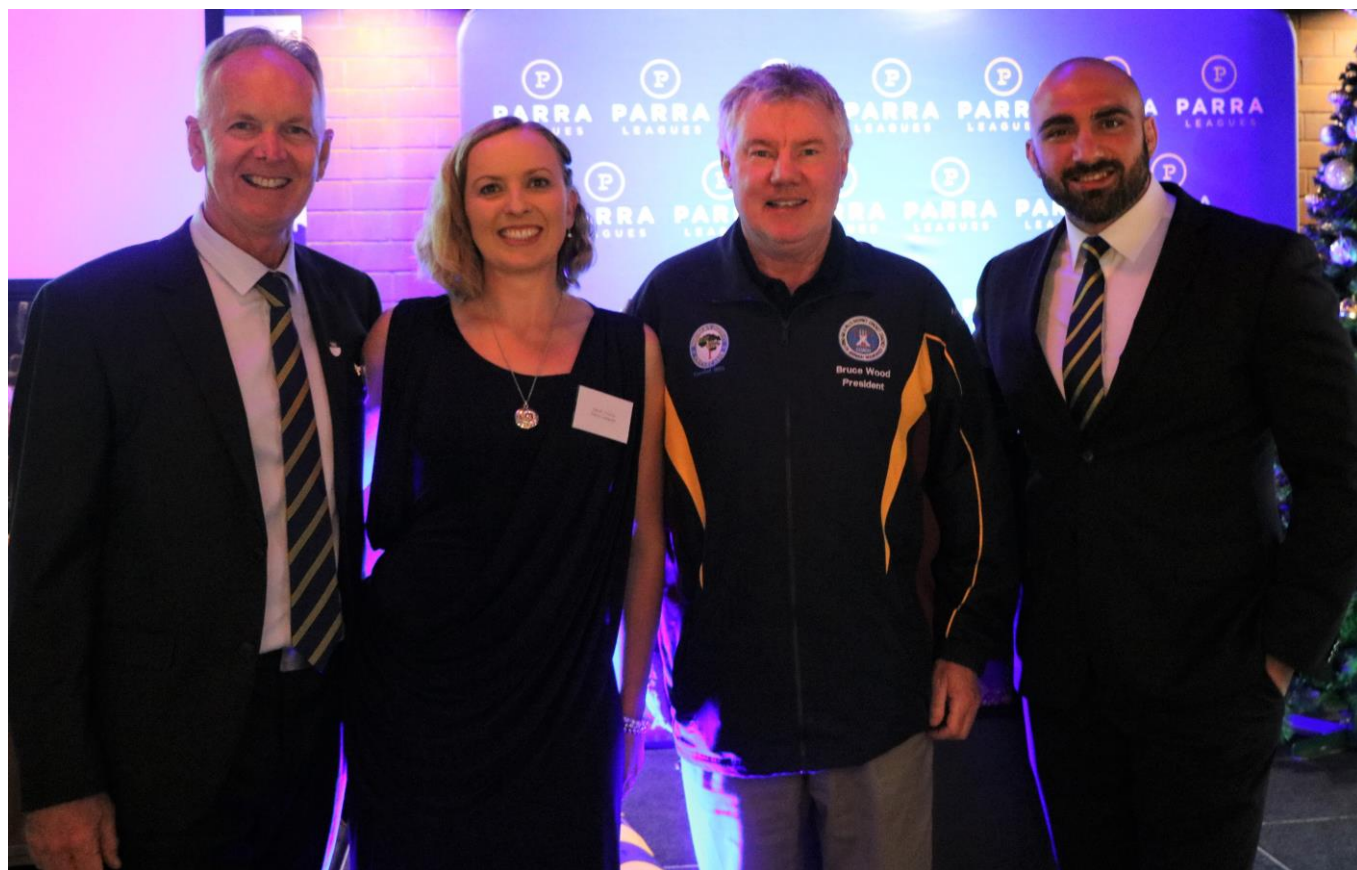

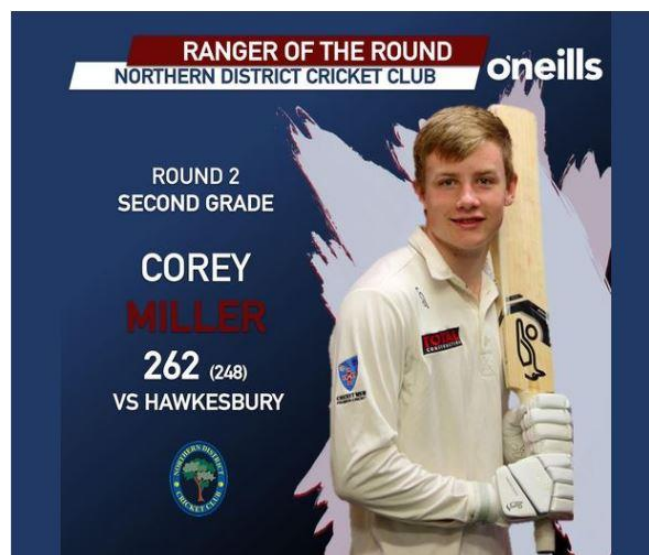
LACHLAN SHAW AND COREY MILLER

Two Coaches' Association youngsters break records for Northern District CC

Lachlan Shaw scored his maiden First Grade century (**107**) on 3-Oct-20 against Hawkesbury in only his second Belvidere Cup appearance to break a 49-year-old record. At 17 years and 282 days, Lachy is the **youngest batsman to reach triple figures in ND's First Grade history**, bettering the mark set by former Test opener Ian "Whiz" Davis in 1971, when he scored 121 as an 18-year-old. Lachy is pictured below with Ben Davis, ND's captain.

In Second Grade, 17-year-old **Corey Miller** struck an astonishing **262** runs on 3-Oct-20 against Hawkesbury to go to number five on the list of all-time top scores in NSW Premier Cricket – Second Grade's 125-year history. **Corey's huge score is the highest individual score in NDCC history, dating back to 1925-26.** He scored his 262 off only 248 deliveries, including 29 x 4s and 5 x 6s (a total of 146 runs in boundaries).

Lachy and Corey attended many HKHDCCA school holiday clinics and off-season development programs in their younger years, plus they played in the RTC and GHC fixtures, which are organised by the Coaches' Association. They starred on the HKHDCCA / NDCC U/15 rep. tour to Barbados, West Indies, in July 2017 (see photo below). They both regularly coach for HKHDCCA when their cricket commitments allow it. We congratulate Lachy and Corey on their incredible scores, which were achieved in the 'pressure' weeks leading up to their HSC exams.

HKHDCCA COACH OF YEAR AWARD – BRUCE WOOD CUP

The Coaches' Association's annual *Coach of Year Award (Bruce Wood Cup)* continues to recognise excellence in cricket coaching within HK&HDCA and surrounding districts. Online nominations were invited for representative and/or club coaching; HKHDCCA clinics; and Blowfly Cricket in 2020-21.

The HKHDCCA Executive Committee determined that **Braden Cheng** (photo – right) was the most deserving recipient of this prestigious award in 2020-21. Braden became a Cricket Australia Representative (Level 2) accredited cricket coach in 2014-15. He coached the HK&HDCA U/12 Cawsey Shield team in 2013-14, and the U/13 Gee Shield team in 2014-15, making the Grand Final both years. Seven of the 12 players in this rep. team were selected in the Cricket NSW Emerging Blues development program.

Braden has coached for HKHDCCA since 2012 at school holiday clinics; off-season development programs; and the U/15 Ross Turner Cup. He was a senior coach at 5 of the 6 school holiday clinics in 2020-21 and Rod Hokin, Head Coach (Level 3 accredited), singled out Braden for special mention during the school holiday clinics at MTO, Waitara in January 2021. Rod noted that Braden had taken his coaching to a high level, leading his group with authority and expertise. Braden now operates at a level whereby he could capably relieve as Head Coach of the Coaches' Association, when required. He assisted with the video analysis of the players at our clinic on 13-14 January 2021 at MTO. He is also a mentor to our younger Community (Level 1) accredited coaches. U/15 REPRESENTATIVE TOUR TO WEST INDIES / USA – JULY 2017

Brief reflections of the tour, including the amazing player advancement in 4 years

The Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) partners with Northern District CC in conducting amazing overseas tours every two years. One of the highlights was our trip to the West Indies and USA in 2017 – bit.ly/WI-Report-17, which included 8 matches in Barbados. The tour was an incredible experience, both on and off the field. We took a large touring party comprising 14 players, 3 coaches / officials, and 20 family supporters. The opposition teams were mainly U/15 school sides or strong cricket academy teams coached by former West Indian Test players.

After winning the first four matches on tour quite easily, our officials were introduced to Steven Leslie, Director of Cricket, Barbados Cricket Association, at the BCA Sagcor General T20 Championship Final between the University of the West Indies (UWI) and St. Catherine at Kensington Oval. The introduction with the head of Barbados Cricket led to the highlight of our U/15 tour, as we were invited to play a 50 over match against the Barbados National U/17 men's team (see below) at the 3Ws Oval, the newest First Class venue in Barbados. The 3Ws Oval, located on the grounds of the Cave Hill campus of the University of the West Indies, is named in memory of three great Barbados and West Indies cricketers – Sir Frank Worrell, Sir Clyde Walcott and Sir Everton Weekes. This high-level match was played under international playing conditions with the fielding restriction circle, PowerPlays, leg-side Wides, etc. The Barbados National U/17 team was about to travel to Trinidad for the annual West Indies U/17 championships and deemed our U/15 rep. team from Sydney as worthwhile competition.



Our young team showed courage and commitment to bat for 35 overs against tall, strong fast bowlers and high standard spinners. Our boys also bowled well and took 7 wickets. Their captain, Nico Reifer, a member of the Barbados U/19 team and the West Indies U/17 squad, opened the batting and put on a masterclass, scoring 85 runs with superb stroke play and shot selection. Nico Reifer now plays for Surrey in England.



Our Coaches' Association / Northern District CC U/15 team was also privileged to play a match at Empire Cricket Club in Bank Hall; Bridgetown, Barbados, which was formed in 1914 (see photo below). This famous club has produced many West Indian Test cricketers, including Sir Frank Worrell, Sir Everton Weekes, Sir Conrad Hunte, Charlie Griffith, Seymour Nurse, Albert Padmore, Carlisle Best and Roland Holder. The Combermere School U/17 side (Barbados champions) was too strong for our U/15 team, resulting in our second loss in 8 matches on tour. Our coaches agreed that these tougher matches were fantastic for the development of our players.



The Sydney players who went on this tour are now about 18 years old with their futures largely still ahead of them. However, the Coaches' Association and Northern District CC are proud of what they have already achieved in cricket since this tour, as briefly summarised below (with photos from their matches in Barbados in 2017).

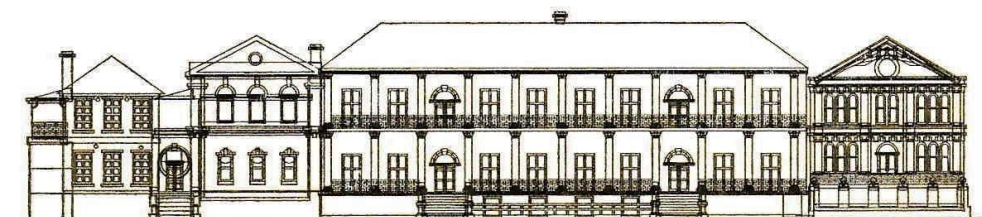
