Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA)

Role, Functions and Objectives



The Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) is a leading cricket coaching organisation responsible for recruiting and accrediting young coaches from within HK&HDCA and north-western Sydney; and conducting junior cricket clinics during the school holidays. HKHDCCA designs and implements coaching programs aimed at increasing the cricket participation, skills and enjoyment of boys and girls aged 6-15, including beginners, club players, representative standard players, and children with special needs. The HKHDCCA organises the annual Ross Turner Cup (RTC) and Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) matches, and conducts U/15 representative team tours overseas every two years.

We have experienced significant growth since our inception in 2010 and aim to continue to expand our subsidised (or free) coaching programs to a wider cross-section of the community, many of whom have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket, including disadvantaged groups, children from non-English speaking communities, and children with special needs. We also strongly support the growth of Girls' cricket at grassroots level. The successful implementation of these initiatives assists in facilitating sporting, cultural and social inclusion for these community groups, while also promoting healthy, active lifestyles, and increasing the participation rate in cricket in NSW.

The responsibilities of our not-for-profit sporting organisation include:

- raising the profile of cricket coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association;
- promoting the objective that all club and representative coaches attain the Cricket Australia Community (Level 1) accreditation as a minimum (preferably Level 2 for representative Shield team coaches);
- organising cricket clinics for players aged 6-14 at Waitara, Normanhurst, West Pennant Hills, Cherrybrook, Hornsby and/or Dundas, in partnership with Northern District CC, during the school holidays;
- providing active Coaches' Association members with professional coaching opportunities at our junior cricket clinics and other junior development programs;
- coordinating the annual HK&HDCA U/15 RTC and U/13 GHC 'showcase' intra Association representative fixtures, including appointing coaches;
- recognising excellence in cricket coaching at club, representative or Coaches' Association levels through our HKHDCCA Coach of the Year award (Bruce Wood Cup);
- arranging a HKHDCCA / NDCC representative cricket tour (U/15 age group) every two years (since 2015);
- increasing the participation of girls in cricket, in consultation with Cricket NSW (Sydney Sixers) and the HK&HDCA Girls Cricket Coordinator, through targeted coaching programs and liaison with schools and clubs;
- organising an annual Community (Level 1) accredited coaching course for HK&HDCA and NDCC members.
- holding two free annual clinics each year for Blowfly Cricket (children with special needs);
- the President representing the Coaches' Association on all cricket coaching matters at the HK&HDCA Council and Executive Meetings;
- seeking corporate sponsorship and Government Grant opportunities to provide additional funding to expand and further subsidise our coaching programs, and purchase additional equipment as required;
- ensuring that all coaches aged 18 and over have a current Working with Children Check 5-year clearance;
- conducting a free Beginners session, teaching cricket fundamentals to 'first time' players each year;
- assisting clubs by running some coaching sessions and demonstrating coaching drills to new club coaches;
- providing a mentor service to coaches as required, especially new or young coaches seeking guidance;
- promoting our activities and coaching programs via the HK&HDCA website and the Coaches' Association's social media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn).

President's Report



The Coaches' Association had a somewhat disrupted season in 2021-22 due to Covid-19 restrictions and wet weather, however still recorded some noteworthy achievements.

School Holiday Junior Cricket Clinics (in partnership with Northern District CC):

The Coaches' Association scheduled two junior cricket clinics during the September 2021 school holidays, however they had to be cancelled due to Covid-19. HKHDCCA held three successful clinics in January 2022 and two clinics in April 2022. A total of 310 children attended the five clinics, which averaged 62 per clinic.

Coaching Awards: Congratulations to Tim Thompson from Hornsby District CC for winning the Coach of the Year award (*Bruce Wood Cup*) in 2021-22. The HKHDCCA President's Award was won by Jamie McEvoy, and the Rookie Coach Award was won by Dylan Bish.

Sponsorship: The Coaches' Association's strong partnership with Parramatta Leagues Club continued for a seventh year in 2022. We thank the club for its generous support of our coaching and youth development programs.

Tom Richmond OAM (Patron): We were sad to hear that Tom passed away in September 2021 after a long illness.

U/15 Girls Cricket Tour to New Zealand:

The Coaches' Association / Northern District CC had planned an U/15 Girls Cricket Tour to New Zealand (North Island) in January 2022, however it was cancelled due to Covid-19. We will attempt to reschedule another Girls representative cricket tour in 2023.

Cricket NSW / Sydney Sixers / HK&HDCA Girls Master Blaster Hubs:

The Coaches' Association supplied coaches for the Master Blaster Hubs at Thornleigh (Dani Chivers) and Warrina Street, Berowra (Cooper and Blake Davenport). Four HKHDCCA coaches also helped Cricket NSW by working as casual Program Coordinators in the local schools.

Blowfly Cricket: HKHDCCA held a free coaching session on 12 January 2022 for Blowfly Cricket, a wonderful organisation that provides children and adults with special needs the opportunity to play a hybrid form of cricket.

RTC and GHC: HKHDCCA again coordinated the annual U/15 Ross Turner Cup and U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup 'showcase' matches, which were scheduled for 27 February 2022, however they were washed out.

School Holiday Cricket Clinics

(in partnership with Northern District CC)



The Coaches' Association scheduled seven cricket clinics during the school holidays in 2021-22.

The Coaches' Association scheduled two junior cricket clinics during the September 2021 school holidays, however they had to be cancelled due to Covid-19. HKHDCCA held three successful clinics in January 2022, and two clinics in April 2022. The venues were Montview Oval, Hornsby Heights; Greenway 2 Oval, Cherrybrook; and George Thornton Reserve, West Pennant Hills.

A total of 310 children attended the five clinics that took place in 2021-22, which averaged an impressive 62 boys and girls per clinic.

The clinics cater for all cricket standards from beginners to representative standard players. The players (aged between 5 and 14) receive plenty of group and individual coaching from experienced coaches, many of whom have played First Grade men's and women's cricket for Northern District CC.

HKHDCCA has a Government-approved Covid-19 Safety Management Plan, which was enacted at each program in 2021-22. The coaches did a terrific job, helping the youngsters develop their skills through a range of coaching drills and games-based activities. The clinics included a wide range of activities for the boys and girls, including video analysis of the bowlers' actions.

The players were placed in small groups in line with their age, ability and friendship groups, and received specialist coaching on defensive and aggressive batting, shot selection, pace and spin bowling, catching, throwing, wicket-keeping skills; game-awareness / tactics, match preparation, fitness and training in the nets.

The players also benefited from a variety of age-specific coaching drills, concluding with Super 8 matches on the oval to reinforce the cricket skills learnt, develop teamwork and introduce a competitive but friendly element to the games.



The Coaches' Association presented a major award (Phillip Hughes Medal) at each clinic to recognise outstanding sportsmanship, teamwork, enthusiasm, performance and spirit of cricket. The winners in 2021-22 were: Jack English, Josef Stransky, Daniel Fagg, Marcus Neilly, Ariv Raina. Free Community (Level 1) Accredited Coaching Courses





The coaching courses were facilitated by **Josh Miller**, an experienced Cricket Australia Representative (Level 2) accredited coach; Head Coach of the Northern District CC U/16 AW Green Shield premiership teams (2018-19 and 2020-21); Director of Cricket – Barker College; and Life Member – Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA).

VALE: Thomas Stanley Richmond OAM, JP, BA, Dip Teach



It is with great sadness that we recognise the passing of **Tom Richmond** OAM, who died on 14 September 2021, aged 80.

Tom dedicated over six decades of his life to cricket as a player, coach and administrator, ranging through various school teams, club teams, HK&HDCA representative teams, AW Green Shield teams, Ross Turner Cup, Glenn Hourigan Cup, and 'Northern Cricket'.¹

As Nathan Tilbury (HK&HDCA Life Member and Councillor, Hornsby Shire Council) advised at Tom's funeral on 24 September 2021, Tom's life could be broadly grouped into four main categories – Life-long Educator; Our Greatest Local Historian; Effective Government Agitator and Community Advocate; and Exceptional Youth Cricket Coach. This tribute briefly focuses on Tom's involvement in Cricket, which Ross Turner outlined at Tom's funeral.

Tom coached the HK&HDCA U/16 Watson Shield teams for nearly two decades, and the Northern District CC U/16 AW Green Shield teams for 16 years, winning four titles.

Tom received an Order of Australia Medal in 2002 for "services to youth through education and cricket, and to researching the history of Hornsby". He was also awarded the Australian Sports Medal (services to cricket); Australian Centenary Medal (services to local history); the NSW Premiers' Community Service Award; a NSW Seniors' Award; an Australian Volunteers' Award; and the Hornsby Shire Heritage Award. Tom was the Founder of the HK&HDCA U/15 Ross Turner Cup match in 1998-99, and the younger Glenn Hourigan Cup fixture in 2003-04. He successfully managed these annual events for 12 years before passing the responsibility to Bruce Wood, President, Coaches' Association, in 2010-11. He was inducted as a Life Member of HK&HDCA in 1981; a Life Member of Northern District CC in 2012; and the inaugural Life Member of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) in 2014.

One of the highlight's of the Coaches' Association's 5th AGM on 17 June 2014 was the induction of Tom Richmond OAM as HKHDCCA's first Life Member Tom was very appreciative and responded with a brief speech.

Tom thanked the Coaches' Association, especially Bruce Wood, for such a fantastic gesture, stating that he was very honoured to become the first Life Member.

Tom said that this meant a lot more to him than many people would imagine. He recalled that he always dreamt of this style of organisation and now HK&HDCA is set up for life, as we have a dedicated coaching organisation that will only get better.

Tom noted that throughout history in this district, cricket has never had an organisation like this. He attempted to improve coaching standards many years ago by running seminars and lectures, enticing club coaches along with the promise of free food and drinks. Former Australian Test player, Brian Taber, attended one of these seminars before becoming the State coach.

Tom advised that he produced a coaching guide with many people from NDCC and the association, before running the first Level 1 accreditation course in NSW. He added that the Coaches' Association gives him a great thrill as there have been several attempts to set up an organisation like this, and now we have finally got there. Tom said it is great to see the coaches in action and he is a big supporter of the high quality work done by HKHDCCA.

Tom played in Barker College's 1st XI team in 1957 before undertaking Teachers College in Wagga, fully involving himself in playing and coaching cricket, initially in the country around Woodenbong and Kyogle, before returning to the Hornsby district where he had grown up.

Tom was the Northern District CC Green Shield coach for a period of 16 years, and was the manager (coach) when they won their first AW Green Shield title in 1968-69. That commenced a rich period of success for NDCC, winning 4 Green Shield titles in a period of 11 seasons.

Tom was a co-founder of the NDCC Schoolboy's Cup with Neil Marks in 1976-77. In 2020-21, NDCC inaugurated the Tom Richmond Medal for the Player of the ND Cup Final.

This was first presented by Ross Turner at ND's Presentation Night in April 2021 at Hornsby RSL, and Tom was delighted to know that this award was named in his honour. The HK&HDCA representative player of the year trophy is also named after Tom, as is the NSWDC junior coaches' trophy. Tom also contributed to cricket in areas outside of playing and coaching, serving as an umpire, as well as in various administrative roles across several cricket organisations, including chairman, team manager, publicity officer, representative secretary, vice president and liaison officer, to name but a few. The formation of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council (NMCC) on 20 December 1993, on the initiative of Ross Turner and under the Chairmanship of Tom Richmond, gave a great boost to coaching in the district. The foundation members were HK&HDCA, Pennant Hills and Epping Shires clubs, Northern District CC, Northern Districts Cricket Association, and representatives from the local secondary and primary schools.

Numerous coaching schemes were conducted under the NMCC banner over the next decade including: the provision by Northern District CC of coaches for HK&HDCA's representative teams; pre-season coaching clinics for players organised by John Whelan from NDCC; pre-season training by Ross Turner, Matthew Phelps and John Hopkins for representative players; and the innovative "Winter Spin" and "Emerging Bluegums" projects conducted by Tom Richmond.

Bruce Wood advised that the successful "Winter Spin" program was held at James Park, Hornsby from the late 1990s to around 2005. Tom liaised with the HK&HDCA Representative Secretary to invite approximately 15 – 20 of the most promising young spin bowlers in the Association each year. Tom was absolutely in his element when he planned these monthly off-season sessions on Sundays, spoke to the bowlers at length, demonstrated the techniques and subtleties of spin bowling, and relating old cricket stories.



He sometimes videoed the bowlers' actions and gave them individual feedback and tips.

Tom compiled many leaflets on batting, pace and spin bowling, captaincy, and former famous players, and these were popular handouts to the players at the end of each session. Tom loved spin bowling and often said that many of his former Watson Shield and AW Green Shield premiership teams were dominant through their superior spinners.

The lucky young spin bowlers who attended this unique "Winter Spin" program will never forget Tom and the positive influence he had on their spin bowling and their lives in general.

Nathan Tilbury (HK&HDCA Life Member and Councillor, Hornsby Shire Council) advised Tom was raised in the family home at Asquith, however, he had deep family connections on the Hawkesbury River. From 1861, his great grandfather, Vincent William Seymour, began farming in the area that would later be named Brooklyn. Where Seymour's dairy farm was located would later be the site of the Shire's most recently constructed sports field.

It was delivered after much agitation from Tom to turn the wasteland area into something useful, as was previously committed to by Sydney Water when they built the sewage treatment plant located behind where the sports ground now stands. Today the large sports field is known as the "Old Dairy" and it was officially opened for Hornsby Shire Council by Mayor, Steve Russell, on 16 January 2016. Tom bowled the first ball in the inaugural cricket match played there, and Alf James OAM was one of the umpires in the match between Berowra and Kenthurst.

Alf James OAM (HK&HDCA Life Member and historian) advised that for four seasons from 1966-67, Tom formed a team that he named "Perseverance" consisting of the best U/16 players in the district (mainly drawn from HK&HDCA Watson Shield and NDCC Green Shield teams), assisted by three older people – himself, Bob Lidbetter snr and Derek Waring. Bob, a superb coach from Nowra, usually captained the team and advised the batsmen, whilst Tom counselled the bowlers. The team played four seasons in B Grade, then the second highest grade, and made the final each season, twice being Premiers.

RTC and GHC Captains, Coaches, Umpires and Special Guests – 2017/18 (20th Anniversary match of the Ross Turner Cup).

This was a remarkable case of theory being put into practice. Alf's team played against Perseverance 9 times for 8 losses and one win by 3 runs! Most of the talented boys only played one or two seasons in this Perseverance team, as they were snapped up by the local Grade clubs. In 1970-71, Alf and his cricketing mates got up an A Grade team in Thornleigh CC. Alf approached Tom to be captain and he brought a couple of his 1969-70 team with him. He was, in fact, captain / coach of the team and most of the older players benefitted from his coaching. One of our players, Richard Martin (Secretary / Treasurer of the Association), then aged about 25, was a big, strong fellow who bowled medium pace off a short run. Tom got at him to practice bowling off a long run in the nets at Pennant Hills Oval and he became the fastest bowler in the Association, after Franken. In one match at Parklands Oval, he took seven wickets, all bowled, for 22 runs.



Tom took over 500 career wickets in all HK&HDCA competitions with his fast in-swingers and leg-spin bowling.

Ross Turner advised that Tom used his extensive knowledge of the game, guided players intuitively and communicated concepts and practices with clarity, to create a productive environment in which individuals and teams could prosper – and they did. Tom was instrumental in developing highly proficient cricketers, some of whom progressed to First Grade level and to win premierships. Within this cohort several were selected to play First Class cricket and two graduated to the international arena. This speaks to the quality of his coaching undertaken at the local level and in consequence, these ground-breaking methods would impact at national level, as well as being adopted on a global scale. Tom's best coaching practices were promoted and taken up overseas.

Tom studied and learned from history [as we all should] and this influenced his actions and those within his domain – students, historians and cricketers alike. He was a person of conviction and his manner / voice carried a level of authority, as it did compassion. His capacity to relate and communicate with others was arguably his greatest strength. Typically, he would set the scene, use his extensive knowledge or experience as a guide, define roles, and artfully engage his players in the task at hand. Importantly, Tom would empower his captain to implement plans and to use their wits in a quest to reach a position of advantage.

He was attentive at every stage, rarely meddled once plans were set, and encouraged input from all. He created an open environment that enabled players to perform and this bred confidence, as it did a sense of fulfilment and fun. We were propelled into senior levels of cricket and we sought to abide the principles and practices that Tom had instilled in us.

We embraced his approach, remaining confident in the knowledge that each element of a team's performance mattered and that building effective relationships were key to attaining an end goal. Tom was a fine enabler and a brilliant coach.

Ross Turner Cup – 24th Annual Match



HK&HDCA's showcase junior representative match called the Ross Turner Cup (RTC) has been held since 1998-99 and features the outstanding players in our district from the U/15 age group and below. The Founder of this annual contest was **Tom Richmond** OAM, Life Member of Northern District CC, HK&HDCA and the Coaches' Association, who passed the responsibility to **Bruce Wood**, President, Coaches' Association, in 2010-11.

One of the objectives of the RTC fixtures was the early identification of players with talent and commitment, to provide high level coaching and development opportunities for these players. It was hoped that many of them would successfully progress through the HK&HDCA Shield junior representative teams; play AW Green Shield and Grade Cricket with Northern District CC; or A Grade within the HK&HDCA Senior Competition.

The Cup is named in honour of **Ross Turner**, one of our Association's finest products, who became Northern District's most successful captain, winning two First Grade premierships in 1985-86 and 1986-87. He was voted as Captain of the Year by the Sydney Cricket Association on three occasions. Ross played for Pennant Hills CC and NDs before working for Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia, pioneering development activities. In 1998, Ross was appointed by the International Cricket Council (ICC) as its initial Global Development Manager. He was based at Lords and facilitated the development of cricket in nations such as Bangladesh, Nepal, China, Malaysia, Kenya, Zimbabwe, Uganda, Afghanistan, Ireland, Canada, Denmark and Netherlands. Ross is now the Director of Cricket at Newington College and the Convenor of GPS cricket in Sydney.

Bruce Wood OAM has been the President of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) since 2010; a member of the HK&HDCA Executive Committee since 2007; Honorary Umpires' Coordinator for the Associated Schools of NSW (CAS) since 2017; and the RTC / GHC Convenor since 2010.

He has umpired over 300 club and/or representative matches for HKHDCUA since 2001-02, and more than 600 matches in all competitions. Bruce has umpired 16 RTC fixtures; 18 NSWDCU / NSWYC Shield Finals; two Cricket NSW U/14 State Challenge Finals (SCG in 2013, and Bradman Oval, Bowral in 2015). He has umpired overseas in Sri Lanka in 2015, Barbados in 2017 and India in 2019 on the Coaches' Association / Northern District CC U/15 representative cricket tours.

Bruce received an OAM in the Australia Day Honours List on 26 January 2022 for his service to cricket over nearly 50 years. He was recognised by Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia as the Community Match Official of the Year at the national 'A Sport For All' Awards in 2020

Bruce jointly holds (with Bryan Whitlock – 178 no) the HK&HDCA record for the highest partnership for the 5th wicket in any Senior grade – 320* runs set in 2000-01 for Normanhurst-Warrawee CC at Normanhurst Oval (Bruce scored 138 no). He is a Life Member of four cricket bodies – HK&HDCA; Normanhurst-Warrawee CC; Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA); and Barker CC.

Scott Reid is the Executive Officer (and Life Member) of HK&HDCA; and a former President of the Umpires' Association (HKHDCUA). He has umpired approximately 200 matches for HKHDCUA since 1998-99, plus two NSWDCU Shield Finals; the Final of the NSW Schools Championship Cup in November 2019; two GHC fixtures and the past three RTC matches.

Scott has completed 33 seasons as a player for Beecroft CC in the HK&HDCA competitions, starting in the U/16s back in 1985-86. He served 10 seasons on both the Association's Executive and Senior Competition Committee between 1994-95 to 2004-05.

Scott jointly holds (with Adam Nash – 329) the HK&HDCA record for the highest partnership for any wicket in any Senior grade – 7th wicket, 427 runs in the B Reserve Grade Final at Parklands Oval in 1990-91 (Scott scored 212 no in a team total of 725 runs). Scott has scored approximately 9,000 runs in senior cricket, including six centuries and 45 half-centuries; won four Association batting awards, and won seven premierships.

He has also provided sound financial advice to the Executive Committee, when required.

Nick is a powerful all-rounder, being a hard-hitting right-handed batsman, and a right-arm pace bowler. He played club cricket for Mount Colah CC, winning several premierships; and rep. cricket for HK&HDCA, winning the U/15 Weblin Shield in 2011-12.




Bruce previously received the Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia 'A Sport for All' Community Match Official of the Year awards in 2020.

HKHDCCA Coach of the Year Award

Bruce Wood Cup



The Coaches' Association's annual Coach of the Year Award (*Bruce Wood Cup*) recognises excellence in cricket coaching within HK&HDCA and surrounding districts. Online nominations were invited for representative and/or club coaching; HKHDCCA coaching programs; and Blowfly Cricket in 2021-22.

This award is designed to showcase outstanding coaches who have demonstrated commitment, innovation and skills development in their roles, including introducing strategies to increase junior participation and inclusiveness.

The HKHDCCA Executive Committee determined that **Tim Thompson** from Hornsby District CC was the most deserving recipient of this prestigious award in 2021-22. Below is a brief outline of his coaching achievements.

- Tim started as the Milo (Kanga Cricket) Co-ordinator and ran the program for 5 years where numbers increased from 30 when he started to 82 when he handed over the role. The highlights included (twice) taking the Milo boys and girls out into the middle of the SCG during a Test match lunch break.
- Following on from Milo, Tim became the club's Junior Coordinator, which he undertook for 10 years. During this time, he coached every year from U/8 – U/17 where once they reached competition age, they made every HK&HDCA semi-final; were U/11 and U/15 Grand Finalists; and U/14 and U/17 Premiers.
- During his time as Junior Coordinator the number of teams increased from 9 to 16 and Hornsby District CC received the HK&HDCA Junior Club Championship Award 3 years in a row. Tim re-introduced a successful pre-season Junior Skills Day at Montview Oval with the assistance of the club's committee and senior players, which helped the new coaches, plus the boys and girls get off to a positive start to the season.
- He completed the Cricket Australia Community (Level 1) Accredited Coaching Course 4 times over 15 years to help himself improve as a coach and to accompany/mentor new parent coaches and volunteers coming through the club.





Letter from the President Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA)

27 August 2021



To all players, parents, coaches, club officials, sponsors, volunteers and supporters.

As you know, the Covid lockdown in Sydney is affecting everyone in terms of schooling, work, sport and social activities with family and friends. I hope everyone is managing the situation as well as possible, exercising regularly to keep fit, following the Government's Covid protocols to stay safe and avoid any further spread of the virus, and also looking after your wellbeing. Being confined largely to our homes can be isolating, so it is important that we stay connected and in touch with our family and friends, even if it is online or by phone.

The Coaches' Association was founded in 2010 and is the largest not-for-profit junior cricket development organisation in NSW, with a Cricket Australia High Performance (Level 3) accredited Head Coach;

10 current Representative (Level 2) coaches, and over 20 Community (Level 1) coaches. The coaches are trained and responsible for significantly developing the skills, techniques, confidence and enjoyment of hundreds of boys and girls each year.

HKHDCCA recruits and accredits impressive young coaches; conducts junior cricket clinics during the school holidays;

organises U/15 overseas cricket tours every two years; administers the annual HK&HDCA U/15 Ross Turner Cup and U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup 'showcase' junior matches;

arranges an annual Community (Level 1) accredited coaching course (in consultation with Cricket NSW);

promotes excellence in cricket coaching via the presentation of some prestigious annual coaching awards; and conducts free coaching clinics each year for Beginners and BlowFly Cricket (children with special needs). The school holiday cricket clinics and overseas tours are undertaken in partnership with Northern District CC.

For the past six weeks, I have been doing special posts on the Coaches' Association's Instagram page www.instagram.com/coaches.association, featuring a different player or coach each day with a 10 photo spread and supportive comments. Each post highlights their journey from junior to senior cricket, including their attendance at our school holiday junior cricket clinics;

selection in HK&HDCA representative teams; and their participation in the annual RTC and GHC matches, which are organised by the Coaches' Association.

The players who went on our three overseas tours (Sri Lanka – 2015; West Indies – 2017; and India – 2019) are being featured, along with our regular coaches, many of whom now play Grade cricket for Northern District CC. The intention of these daily Instagram posts is to highlight the players and coaches, show where the Coaches' Association has assisted in their development, and importantly, to give them a 'shout out' and hopefully a small boost at this difficult time.

I have received some very positive feedback from the players featured so far, and on a few occasions, from their appreciative parents, so I intend to keep up these daily posts for several months to come.

Although we acknowledge that many businesses and sporting organisations have been more adversely affected by Covid than HKHDCCA, the pandemic has had a significant impact on the Coaches' Association.



We had organised an U/15 Boys representative cricket tour to the Sunshine Coast to participate in the International Cricket Academy League tournament in July 2021 – refer: www.bit.ly/CA-ICAL-21, however this trip was cancelled just a week before our scheduled departure, due to the NSW / QLD State border closures.

HKHDCCA had also organised two school holiday junior cricket clinics in late September 2021, however they had to be cancelled due to Covid. This was obviously disappointing, as all six of our popular school holiday clinics in 2020-21 were sold out – refer to our 11th Annual Report – www.bit.ly/CA-AR-20-21 The Coaches' Association will schedule three junior cricket clinics during the January 2022 school holidays.

We have a Government approved Covid Safety Plan and we take all necessary precautions to operate in a Covid-safe way, as we did last season. Many of our coaches are already fully vaccinated against Covid and we have actively encouraged the others to get this done as soon as possible.

The Coaches' Association held its AGM on 7 June 2021 and I'm pleased to advise that the five volunteers on our Executive Committee have agreed to continue in their respective roles in season 2021-22, which provides our organisation with ongoing expertise and stability.

There are some new faces on our General Committee – refer: www.bit.ly/CA-Committee-21-22 and we look forward to their ideas and fresh input.

We are thinking about our terrific sponsors, Parramatta Leagues Club, and look forward to using their facilities again for committee meetings, dinners and social functions when they reopen. The Coaches' Association is organising an exciting U/15 Girls Cricket Tour to New Zealand in January 2022, in partnership with Northern District CC, subject to Covid-19 international travel restrictions being lifted by then.

Arrangements are progressing well, and we plan to confirm the dates, tour coaches, opposition teams, ovals, accommodation bookings and the overall cost of the tour shortly when the Covid situation in Sydney improves.


We already have 10 talented female cricketers who have expressed interest in being selected for this development tour. I would welcome any further enquiries from interested U/15 girls, via their parents.



BlowFly Cricket Report



The Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) is proud to have been associated with Blowfly Cricket for the past 11 years, mainly through the provision of free coaching sessions at MTO, Waitara and other venues, plus volunteering at the Blowies' fund-raising BBQs at Bunnings Warehouse, Thornleigh.

The close working relationship between the Coaches' Association and Blowfly Cricket originated and continues to prosper through the long-standing friendship between Mark Rushton (Founder of Blowfly Cricket in 2009) and Bruce Wood (President, Coaches' Association since 2010).

Mark and Bruce had previously worked together on the Executive Committee of HK&HDCA, where they are both Life Members, and they seized the opportunity for their two organisations to work together for mutual benefit of children, junior cricket and the community.

Blowfly Cricket was formed when Mark Rushton had an inspired vision that all children with special needs deserve the opportunity to enjoy cricket and improve their eye / hand co-ordination and confidence by learning new skills and interacting with other children and families in a supportive, sporting environment.

The children's special needs include autism, Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, Asperger's, and verbal and hearing deficits. They play a hybrid form of cricket on Saturday afternoons at James Park, Hornsby during Terms 4 and 1 (cricket season), followed by a family BBQ. They also play cricket on Friday evenings with WPHC CC at James Henty Reserve, Dural; and female social cricket at NDCC's home ground on Wednesday evenings.

The modified coaching techniques that need to be adopted have proved to be a valuable learning tool for HKHDCCA's young, accredited coaches.

The Coaches' Association held a free coaching session for Blowfly Cricket at Montview Oval, Hornsby Heights, on 12 January 2022. The coaches who helped the Blowies at this session were **Bruce Wood, Dani Chivers** and **Ryan Swain**. HKHDCCA congratulates the President of Blowfly Cricket, Jordan Jones, on her inspirational leadership of the organisation, under the mentorship of Founder, Mark Rushton. We wish them well on their exciting journey, which is benefiting so many children and adults with special needs.

One of the highlights of Blowfly Cricket has been the success of their "Coaching the Uncoachables" program, whereby suitable Blowfly cricketers attend a modified Community (Level 1) coaching course to gain a formal accreditation, which they use to coach at the Blowies' various programs. Mark and Jordan approached Bruce Wood and asked if the Coaches' Association would be prepared to engage some BlowFly cricketers as Assistant Coaches at the HKHDCCA / NDCC school holiday (mainstream) junior cricket clinics. This was successfully implemented in 2021-22 when **Aaron Lewis, Ronnie MacKenzie, William Hanks** and **Akanksha Swarup** attended part or all of a particular junior clinic.





Corey's parents, Wendy and Sean Miller, flew to UK in June to visit Corey and he greeted them with a century in the first match they attended.



The Coaches' Association is always delighted when our former players and coaches get selected in high-level teams.

Baxter Holt was coached by HKHDCCA Head Coach, Rod Hokin, in the King's School 1st XI; the GPS 1st XI; the Northern District CC U/16 AW Green Shield team; on the HKHDCCA / NDCC U/15 Sri Lanka tour; and privately for many years.

Baxter is the current NSW Blues wicket-keeper / batsman and is on a full playing contract with Cricket NSW and Sydney Thunder in the BBL.

He was captain of the HKHDCCA / NDCC U/15 Academy team that toured Sri Lanka in 2015 (scoring two centuries), and later returned to Sri Lanka as captain of the Australian U/19 team in 2018-19. Baxter was a specialist batting and wicket-keeping coach for HKHDCCA in 2016 and 2017.

Lachlan Shaw has earned a Cricket NSW Rookie Contract in 2022-23 as a wicket-keeper / batsman, after his excellent season in the NDCC First Grade team in 2021-22, and representing the Australian team in the ICC U/19 World Cup in the West Indies in January / February 2022.

Lachy attended many HKHDCCA / NDCC junior cricket clinics in his youth and won our prestigious Phillip Hughes Medal in 2015.

He was a member of the HKHDCCA / NDCC U/15 academy team in Sri Lanka in 2015, before being captain of our touring team in Barbados in 2017. Lachy was also coached by Rod Hokin at King's, on the HKHDCCA overseas tours, as well as privately.

Supporting Indigenous Children in Bourke



The Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) was pleased to again support Eternity Aid www.eternityaid.org.au/ with a special cricket clinic on 4 June 2022 for Bourke Public School, which has over 200 students, 78% of which are of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent.

Matt Wright, who started his cricket coaching with HKHDCCA in 2015, is a volunteer for Eternity Aid, an organisation which began in 2005 with the aim of providing educational and life skills programs for Aboriginal youth, particularly in Bourke in far northwestern NSW. Matt, who now plays First Grade for Gordon DCC in the NSW Premier Cricket Belvidere Cup competition, submitted the following report.

I was fortunate enough to be invited back to Bourke this year to run another cricket program for Eternity Aid, supported by the Coaches Association. Our visit took place in the first week of June and whilst rain threatened to keep us off the field, we enjoyed a rare stint of sunshine - just in time for some cricket! The participants were between the ages of 6 and 13 and had ranging abilities. Very few had previously had an opportunity to play any organised cricket. We held the clinic on a Saturday as the weather was unsuitable the previous day. We were pleased to see some familiar faces from our school visits on the Friday join us for this cricket session.

With a smaller sized group due to winter sports and a dicey forecast ahead, we decided to get stuck into a game straight away. You sometimes need to improvise in the country, so we used a footpath in the park as the cricket pitch! The session was mainly about participation and enjoyment, although I passed on some coaching tips. We focused on grip and stance when batting, where players found great improvement in body position and clean contact with the ball, after some minor tweaks. Front arm was the focus with bowling, to ensure players were able to bowl a consistently good line. Finally, everyone showed great attitude and enthusiasm in the field, chasing balls around Central Park for hours.
