What is the Ross Turner Cup?



The Ross Turner Cup was inaugurated in 1998-99 to promote an opportunity for the best of our U/15 players to appear in a 'showcase' game of high level representative cricket. The idea developed from the work of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council in the 1990's, which brought together representatives of grade, shires, district and school local cricket organisations to achieve mutual benefit by working in close collaboration.

One of its objectives was to accelerate the 'career paths' of our outstanding cricketers in order to fast track their elevation to First Grade, or as high a standard as each individual was capable of achieving. At last count, 13 players have graduated from the HK&HDCA Ross Turner Cup match to play First Grade cricket in Sydney, as reported elsewhere in this program.

The Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council also recognised that there was no point in playing cricket unless it is played in the true spirit of the game and enjoyed by all participants, in a competitive and healthy environment. The Council took proactive steps in conjunction with the local cricket bodies to achieve this objective. An emphasis on respect for the opposition, the umpires and the laws of the game became a feature of the annual Ross Turner Cup match before the world's governing body incorporated the *spirit of cricket* in the preamble to the MCC Laws of Cricket.

The importance of HK&HDCA maintaining close ties with its local grade club, Northern District at Waitara, is also of vital importance, as our Association is the main feeder of talented players to grade cricket. NDCC officials have attended every Ross Turner Cup match since its inception 12 years ago and they will be here again today, led by President, Mike (Drifter) Langford.

Improving the pathway from the HK&HDCA Northern Knights representative teams, particularly Watson, Weblin and Moore Shields, to ND's U/16 Green Shield squad is an important strategy, which has improved in recent years, however more work still needs to be done in this area. The positive efforts of HKHDCCA (Coaches' Association) in conducting junior coaching clinics in the school holidays in conjunction with NDCC is further fostering the strong link with our local grade club.

The Cup is aptly named in honour of Ross Turner, one of our Association's most famous products. As a young player, Ross was a brilliant all-rounder who bowled leg-spin, batted beautifully and was without peer in the field. He later became a specialist batsman and Northern District's most successful captain, winning two First Grade premierships. Ross worked for Cricket NSW, pioneering development activities, before continuing his magnificent contribution to cricket by working for the ICC in the development of cricket in overseas countries such as China, Malaysia, Afghanistan and India.

The Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup matches were the brainchild of Tom Richmond, OAM, Patron & Life Member of HK&HDCA, who has passed the baton after 11 years of sterling service to Bruce Wood, President of HKHDCCA. It is quite appropriate that our Coaches' Association has taken over the running of these important representative fixtures, as they are all about junior development.

This year's Ross Turner Cup match is scheduled to commence at Parklands Oval at 10.00am on Sunday, 20th March 2011 and each team will face a maximum of 50 overs. The teams have been selected on the basis of performances throughout the season, mainly in representative cricket, however outstanding club form is also taken into account. The teams roughly represent the eastern and western halves of the Association.

The players' shirts have been kindly provided by our generous sponsor, Triforce Sports Pty Ltd. A special thank you to Abbas Aly for this gesture. I'm sure all the players and spectators will thoroughly enjoy today's exciting contest.

Tom Richmond, OAM

Mark Rushton (HK&HDCA President) recently advised the local cricket community that the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) would take over the running of the annual Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup representative fixtures, following the retirement of Tom Richmond, OAM, Patron & Life Member of HK&HDCA.

Much of the history and prestige associated with these showcase matches can be attributed to the great work by Tom Richmond over the past 11 years, supported by other key volunteers.

Tom loves all aspects of cricket however his greatest joy is seeing captains use leg-spin bowlers as an attacking weapon, early in an innings, in order to remove specialist batsmen before they get settled.

Tom has had wonderful 50 year career of continuous involvement in cricket coaching, ranging through various school teams, club teams, inter-district representative teams, Green Shield, Northern Cricket 'Winter Spin' program and the Ross Turner Cup. A brief summary of his amazing career follows:

- Played for Barker College 1st XI in 1957; Teachers' College Wagga Wagga; North Coast Inter-district teams; Kissing Point, Perseverance, Thornleigh and Berowra. Played A Grade as both a pace bowler and a leg spinner. Captained Thornleigh A Grade. Played HK&HDCA Martin Shield representative cricket.
- Country Coaching: Coached Woodenbong (1960/61) in Saturday morning competition in Kyogle, travelling forty miles each week to do so.
- School Cricket: coached 1st XIs at Woodenbong, Bonalbo, Normanhurst, Riverstone and Galston high schools. Cricket convener in North-West Metropolitan Zone, President of Blacktown and Ku-ring-gai Zones. Combined High Schools selector and team manager.
- Green Shield: coached ND Green Shield in about 16 seasons, including winning the club's first Green Shield, as well as several undefeated seasons as either coach or manager. Manager / Coach of several Combined Green Shield teams in matches against the country.
- Representative Cricket for HK&HDCA: coached about 20 separate teams, mainly in Watson Shield.
- Umpired several finals and did NSWPSSA matches against Queensland on a couple of occasions.
- During 1970's initiated and organised coaching seminars at Hornsby prior to the introduction of the certificate system. Organised first training for coach certificates in the Association (about 1980). Organised, with Col Cooper, first major coaching venture across the Association during the 1980's.
- Within the Association, held offices of Publicity Officer, Representative Secretary, Vice President and liaison officer with Northern District. Also acted as Publicity Officer for ND Club briefly.
- Life Member and current Patron of HK&HDCA, current honorary Vice President of NDCC.
- Inaugural Chairperson of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council in 1993, bringing together grade clubs, associations, schools and shires clubs. Foundation Director of 'Northern Cricket' in 1997, a body which provided organised coaching to HK&HDCA junior players.
- Inaugurated the Ross Turner Cup fixtures and organised these matches for over a decade.
- HK&HDCA representative player trophy is named after him, as is the NSW junior coaches' trophy.
- Have been awarded the Australian Sports Medal (services to cricket); the Order of Australia Medal (services to youth); Australian Centenary Medal (services to local history); and the Premiers' Community Service Award (service to the community).
- Has written cricket coverage for the Hornsby Advocate newspaper for the past two years.



What is HKHDCCA?

The **Hornsby, Ku-ring-gai & Hills District Cricket Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA)** was established in 2010 and is responsible for:

- enhancing the ongoing development of our accredited coaches;
- raising the profile of coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association;
- facilitating a future pathway for club and representative coaches;
- providing professional coaching opportunities at our Junior Coaching Clinics with NDCC;
- **co-ordinating the annual Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup representative fixtures;**
- enabling the Association to maintain a record of all Level 1 and 2 accredited coaches.

Bruce Wood is performing the role of HKHDCCA President for the 2010-11 cricket season, supported by **Mark Rushton** as Vice-President, **Mike Burgin** as Secretary, and **David Bennett** as Treasurer (all Level 2 coaches).

HKHDCCA has been honoured by **Ross Turner** accepting the role of Patron. Ross played his early cricket with Pennant Hills CC in the HK&HDCA competition and went on to captain Northern District First Grade to two premierships. In later years, Ross worked for Cricket NSW, pioneering development activities, before going to London to work on cricket development for the ICC. Currently he is involved in the development of cricket in overseas countries such as China, Malaysia, Afghanistan and India. Ross has made a huge contribution to cricket on a worldwide basis, but is still keen to help out with cricket development in our local district. In accepting the appointment of HKHDCCA Patron, Ross wrote *"I welcome the prospect of working with you and the executive of the Coaches' Association to undertake key initiatives that will lead to the highest quality coaching, which in turn, will serve to develop the standard and enjoyment levels of players throughout the Association."* The Association's annual showcase U/15 representative match (Ross Turner Cup) is named in his honour.

Rod Hokin is the HKHDCCA Coaching Co-ordinator (Head Coach), which is another key role for the Coaches' Association. Rod plays First Grade for Northern District CC and is a talented and vastly experienced coach. Rod spent the off-season in 2010 playing professional cricket and coaching in Ireland, UK. He is assisting Bruce Wood in developing a Centre of Excellence within HK&HDCA to effectively accelerate the development of accredited coaches.

HKHDCCA is working in partnership with Northern District CC to promote and run junior Coaching Clinics during the September/October and January school holidays. The first of these Clinics took place in September 2010 at Waitara Oval, which was followed by two more Clinics in January 2011 at Waitara Oval and Kenthurst Park. The written evaluations from the parents were excellent, with many parents expressing their gratitude at the overall coaching ratio of approximately 1 : 6, which provides more individualised coaching opportunities.

The clinics included video analysis of the bowlers' actions; specific coaching on batting, bowling and fielding skills (and wicket-keeping drills where applicable); training in the nets (including turf nets at Waitara); batting against a bowling machine (at Kenthurst); a wide range of coaching drills and games to reinforce the cricket skills learnt and to develop team work; plus a Cricket 'Olympics' event and Super Sixes competitions.

The accredited coaches engaged at the clinics included **Rod Hokin** (Head Coach), **Bruce Wood** (Co-ordinator), **Jono Whealing**, **Dave Lowery**, **Nick Cheadle**, **Andrew Lowe**, **Irfan Baig**, **Tim Matson**, **Jamie Matson**, **Mike Burgin** and **Justin Epthorp**. We were fortunate to have **Ross Turner** as a special guest coach at our Waitara Oval clinic in January 2011. Following the clinic, Ross sent this correspondence to Bruce Wood: *"A short note to extend congratulations to you for your outstanding efforts in coordinating the HKHDCCA – Northern District Cricket Club Coaching Program across the past week. I commend you and Rod Hokin for bringing it all together in fine style. Northern District and HKHDCCA are to be commended on their joint initiative to promote and develop the game across Sydney's north-west region. Congratulations are also offered to the coaches who worked in committed and enthusiastic fashion."*

The next HKHDCCA / NDCC cricket clinics will take place during the Sept./Oct. 2011 school holidays. Enquiries can be directed to Bruce Wood, bruce.wood@hkhdca.com.au, Ph. 0412 688 629.

HKHDCCA is also providing coaching opportunities for some outstanding young coaches, with **Josh Miller**, **Daniel Anderson**, **Nathan Tanner** & **James Madden** being appointed to coach teams in the Glenn Hourigan Cup competition in 2011. This is an exciting new direction for coaching within HK&HDCA, which will also strengthen our band of coaches in charge of our junior *Northern Knights* representative teams in future years.

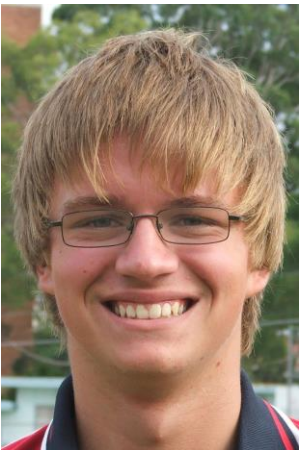

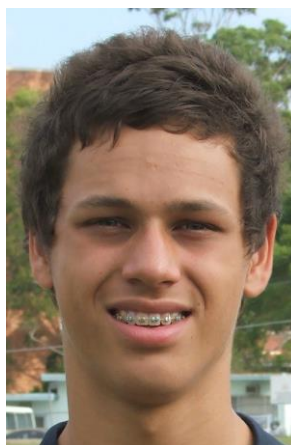

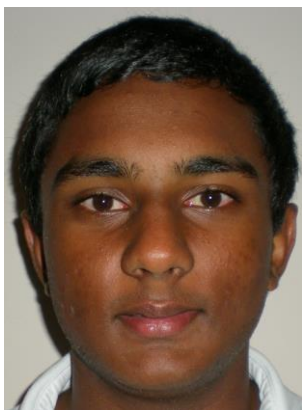
