What is the Ross Turner Cup?



The HK&HDCA Ross Turner Cup (RTC) was inaugurated in 1998-99 to promote an opportunity for the best of our U/15 players to appear in a 'showcase' game of high level representative cricket. The idea developed from the work of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council in the 1990's, which brought together representatives of grade, shires, district and local school cricket organisations to achieve mutual benefit by working in close collaboration.

One of the objectives was to accelerate the 'career paths' of our outstanding young cricketers by the earlier identification of players with talent and commitment, in order to provide high level coaching and development opportunities for these players. It was hoped that many of these players would successfully progress through the HK&HDCA Shield junior representative teams; play Green Shield and Grade Cricket with Northern District CC; or A Grade within the HK&HDCA Senior Competition. Fourteen (14) players have graduated from the RTC match to play First Grade cricket in Sydney, including Timm van der Gugten, who now represents NSW and the Netherlands (see page 5).

The Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council also recognised that cricket needs to be played in the true spirit of the game and enjoyed by all participants, in a competitive and healthy environment. The Council took proactive steps in conjunction with the local cricket bodies to achieve this objective. An emphasis on respect for the opposition, the umpires and the laws of the game became a feature of the annual RTC match before the world's governing body incorporated the *spirit of cricket* in the preamble to the MCC Laws of Cricket.

The RTC and Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) matches were the brainchild of Tom Richmond OAM, Patron and Life Member of HK&HDCA, who passed the responsibility after 11 years to Bruce Wood, President of HKHDCCA (Coaches' Association) in 2010/11, who has maintained the fine tradition and also introduced some new initiatives, including appointing some impressive young RTC and GHC coaches.

The Cup is named in honour of Ross Turner (pictured above), one of our Association's most famous products. As a young player, Ross was a brilliant all-rounder who bowled leg-spin, batted beautifully (left-handed) and was without peer in the field. He later became a specialist batsman and Northern District's most successful captain, winning two First Grade premierships. Ross worked for Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia, pioneering development activities, before continuing his magnificent contribution to cricket by working for the International Cricket Council (ICC) in the development of cricket in overseas countries such as Bangladesh, China, Malaysia, Afghanistan and India.

It is important that HK&HDCA maintains close ties with its local grade club, Northern District CC at Waitara, as our Association is the main feeder of talented players to grade cricket. NDCC officials have attended every Ross Turner Cup match since its inception 13 years ago and they will be here again today, led by President, Mike Langford. Significant steps have been taken in recent years to improve the pathway from the HK&HDCA representative teams, particularly Watson, Weblin and Moore Shields, to ND's U/16 Green Shield squad and lower grade teams. The positive efforts of HKHDCCA (Coaches' Association) in conducting popular junior coaching clinics in the school holidays in conjunction with NDCC is further fostering the strong link with our local grade club.

Today's Ross Turner Cup (50 over) match brings together the leading U/15 and U/14 players in the district in teams which roughly represent the eastern and western halves of the Association. For the first time this year, the Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup matches will be played concurrently on adjacent ovals at Kenthurst Park, which is an exciting initiative that will be appreciated by parents and officials.

The players' shirts have again been kindly provided by our generous sponsor, Triforce Sports Pty Ltd. A special thank you to Abbas Aly (HK&HDCA Representative Secretary) for this gesture. I'm sure all the players and spectators will thoroughly enjoy today's exciting contest.

Today's Ross Turner Cup match is shaping as one of the highest standard contests since they began in 1998-99, as the East and West teams include the majority of players from the HK&HDCA Weblin Shield and Moore Shield teams, which both finished their NSWDCA competitions as joint Premiers in 2011-12.

Role of HKHDCCA

The **Hornsby, Ku-ring-gai & Hills District Cricket Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA)** was established in 2010 and is responsible for:

- raising the profile of coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association
- promoting the objective that all club & representative coaches attain the Level 1 accreditation as a minimum (Rep. Shield coaches Level 2 preferably);
- enhancing the development of accredited coaches and facilitating a future pathway for club & rep. coaches;
- organising Junior Cricket Clinics in partnership with Northern District CC during the September / October and January school holidays;
- developing and implementing a structured development coaching program for the players nominated to attend the HK&HDCA U/10 off-season program for potential Foster Shield (first year) representative players;
- providing HKHDCCA members with professional coaching opportunities at our Junior Cricket Clinics with Northern District CC and at the HK&HDCA off-season junior development programs;
- **co-ordinating the annual Ross Turner Cup and Glenn Hourigan Cup representative fixtures;**
- assisting the HK&HDCA Rep. Secretary with coaching matters relating to the representative teams;
- devising a scholarship scheme designed to provide financial assistance to a limited number of candidates nominated to attend a Cricket NSW accredited coaching course (Level 1, 2 or 3);
- recognising excellence in coaching through the introduction of a new HKHDCCA *Coach of Year* award;
- identifying potential outstanding young coaches and providing coaching opportunities for these individuals;
- providing a mentor service to coaches as required, especially new or young coaches seeking guidance;
- conducting an annual Level 1 accredited coaching course for HK&HDCA and NDCC members.
- enabling the Association to maintain a record of all Level 1 and 2 accredited coaches.

Bruce Wood has performed the role of HKHDCCA President since 2010-11, supported by **Mark Rushton** as Vice-President, **Justin Epthorp** as Secretary, **Rod Hokin** as Head Coach, and **David Bennett** as Treasurer (all Level 2 coaches). HKHDCCA has been honoured to have **Ross Turner** as our Patron for the past two years. Ross played his early cricket with Pennant Hills CC in the HK&HDCA competition before moving on to Northern District CC and a range of important cricket roles within Australia and overseas. In accepting the appointment of HKHDCCA Patron, Ross Turner wrote to Bruce Wood *"I welcome the prospect of working with you and the executive of the Coaches' Association to undertake key initiatives that will lead to the highest quality coaching, which in turn, will serve to develop the standard and enjoyment levels of players throughout the Association."*

The Coaches' Association was awarded the prestigious HK&HDCA Integrity Cup perpetual trophy in 2010-11 for its outstanding contribution to the local game in the Hornsby and surrounding districts.

HKHDCCA conducted two successful cricket clinics during the January 2012 school holidays at Kenthurst and Waitara, with around 100 keen young cricketers in attendance. The accredited coaches engaged at the clinics included **Rod Hokin** (Head Coach), **Bruce Wood** (Co-ordinator), **Andrew Lowe**, **Dave Lowery**, **Justin Epthorp**, **Daniel Wood**, **Josh Miller**, **Mike Burgin**, **James Madden**, **Daniel Anderson** & **Chris Burnett**. HKHDCCA is also providing coaching opportunities for some outstanding young coaches, with **Josh Miller** & **Daniel Anderson** coaching the RTC teams, and **Utkarsh Somaiya**, **Luke Thorburn**, **Will Johnston** & **Matt Vile** coaching the GHC teams in 2012 (including the T20's). This is an exciting new direction for coaching within HK&HDCA, which should also strengthen our band of coaches in charge of our junior representative teams in future years.

The Sydney North Cricket Manager, Cricket NSW, wrote the following about HKHDCCA in August 2011.

"I wish to pass on my congratulations for the fantastic job the Coaches' Association is doing – without doubt 'Best Practice' across Sydney North Associations – if not all of Sydney. HKHDCCA is a wonderful initiative created by local coaches in and around the Hornsby district. The role of junior volunteer sports coaches is an often overlooked area in community sports codes, however is probably the most crucial in terms of retaining and developing players."

HKHDCCA is taking proactive steps towards formally working with volunteers to up-skill their coaching qualifications, expertise and experience. They have identified this objective as a priority and to their credit, have set about running specific programs to recruit and train prospective coaches, whilst also giving the accredited coaches practical experience at clinics. The continued success of HKHDCCA will create further interest in the cricket community and hopefully will encourage other regions throughout Sydney to take on this process, with the end result being a better coaching experience for both the participants and their tutors."

RTC coaches in 2012 – Daniel Anderson and Josh Miller

Daniel Anderson has a very impressive record in club and rep. cricket, as summarised below.

Club cricket (WPHC):

- In 6 years of junior cricket (U11 – U16), he scored 2,544 runs @ 68.76 and took 85 wickets @ 11.27.
- Second youngest A1 Grade player in WPHC history when he debuted in 2010/11 at 15 years of age.
- Has scored 226 runs for WPHC in 2011/12 to lead his club's A1 batting aggregate at age 16.
- In 2010/11, he scored a total of 1,033 runs for WPHC U16, A1 Grade and HK&HDCA Watson Shield.
- Won the HK&HDCA President's Trophy (highest run aggregate for Juniors 2010/11) – 686 runs U16's.
- Won the Baulkham Hills Shire President's Award (HK&HDCA Junior Player of the Year) in 2008/09 and 2010/11.
- Won the WPHC John Coulthard Trophy (Junior Player of the Year) in 2010/11.

HK&HDCA Rep. cricket:

- Played Shield cricket since the U/11 Creak Shield in 2005/06 and was Captain of his Weblin Shield team in 2009/10 and his Watson Shield team 2010/11 when they made the semi-finals.
- Won the Tom Richmond Trophy (Leading Junior Representative player) in 2008/09.
- Won the HK&HDCA Representative Batsman of the Year prize in 2008/09.
