Umpires for today's Ross Turner Cup match

Experienced umpires, **Geoff Hasler** and **Bruce Wood**, have again been appointed to officiate today's Ross Turner Cup match. Both these gents are umpiring their 12th RTC match today.

Geoff is the President and a Life Member of HK&HDCA; a Life Member of the Umpires' Association (HKHDCUA); and a Principal Member of NSWCUA. He has umpired 365 matches for HKHDCUA since 1999/2000, including 14 A Grade Finals; has won the HKHDCUA Umpire of the Year several times and received the prestigious NSWCUA Ted Wykes Medal – Affiliated Association Award in 2015-16.

Bruce is a Life Member and Executive Member of HK&HDCA; President and Life Member of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA); and the RTC / GHC Convenor since 2010-11. He has umpired 257 club or representative matches for HKHDCUA since 2001-02, plus 15 NSWDCU Shield Finals and two Cricket NSW U/14 State Challenge Finals at the SCG in 2013 and at Bradman Oval, Bowral in 2015.



What is the Ross Turner Cup?



The HK&HDCA Ross Turner Cup (RTC) was inaugurated in 1998-99 to promote an opportunity for the best of our U/15 players to appear in a 'showcase' game of high level representative cricket. The idea developed from the work of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council (NMCC) in the 1990's, which brought together representatives of grade, shires, district and local school cricket organisations to achieve mutual benefit by working in close collaboration.

One of the objectives was to accelerate the 'career paths' of our outstanding young cricketers by the early identification of players with talent and commitment, in order to provide high level coaching and development opportunities for these players. It was hoped that many of these players would successfully progress through the HK&HDCA Shield junior representative teams; play AW Green Shield and Grade Cricket with Northern District CC; or A Grade within the HK&HDCA Senior Competition. An amazing 27 players have graduated from the RTC match to play First Grade cricket in Sydney.

The RTC and Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) matches were the brainchild of Tom Richmond OAM, Patron and Life Member of HK&HDCA, who passed on the responsibility after 12 years to Bruce Wood, President of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) in 2010-11, who has maintained the fine tradition and introduced some new initiatives, including appointing impressive young RTC and GHC coaches; scheduling the main 50-over matches on adjacent ovals; and arranging preliminary GHC T20 matches.

The NMCC recognised that cricket needs to be played in the true spirit of the game and enjoyed by all participants, in a competitive and healthy environment. The Council took proactive steps in conjunction with the local cricket bodies to achieve this objective. An emphasis on respect for the opposition, the umpires and the laws of the game became a feature of the annual RTC matches before the world's governing body incorporated the *spirit of cricket* in the preamble to the MCC Laws of Cricket. Bruce Wood holds similar views on how cricket should be played and donated an impressive perpetual trophy in 2008-09 on behalf of the Umpires' Association entitled 'HKHDCA Spirit of Cricket Award for representative cricket' in order to promote excellent sportsmanship by our cricketers.

The Cup is named in honour of Ross Turner (pictured above), one of our Association's most famous products. As a young player, Ross was a brilliant all-rounder who bowled leg-spin, batted beautifully (left-handed) and was without peer in the field. He played for Pennant Hills CC, HK&HDCA rep. teams and later became a specialist batsman and Northern District's most successful captain, winning two First Grade premierships. Ross worked for Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia, pioneering development activities, before continuing his magnificent contribution to cricket by working for the International Cricket Council (ICC) in the development of cricket in overseas countries such as Bangladesh, China, Malaysia, Afghanistan and India. Ross currently heads up cricket at Newington College in Sydney and is the GPS Cricket Convenor. We are delighted that Ross can join us today and meet the players and coaches.

It is important that HK&HDCA maintains close ties with its local grade club, Northern District CC at Waitara, as our Association is the main feeder of talented players to grade cricket. NDCC officials have attended every Ross Turner Cup match since its inception 20 years ago and they will be here again today. Significant steps have been taken over the years to improve the pathway from the HK&HDCA representative teams, particularly Watson, Weblin and Moore Shields, to ND's U/16 Green Shield squad and lower grade teams. The Coaches' Association's popular junior cricket clinics at Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara, which are undertaken in the school holidays in partnership with Northern District CC, have further fostering the strong link with our local grade club. The Coaches' Association's Head Coach, Rod Hokin (Level 3 accredited), has been the NDCC AW Green Shield coach for the past 3 years.

Today's RTC (50 over) match brings together the leading U/15 and U/14 players in the district. The RTC and GHC matches are again being played concurrently on adjacent ovals at Turramurra, which is appreciated by parents with a son playing in each match, as well as HK&HDCA officials and guests. Thanks also to HK&HDCA sponsors, Kookaburra Sport (Cameron Eve) for supplying the match balls and prizes. I'm sure the players and spectators will enjoy today's 20th annual RTC contest.

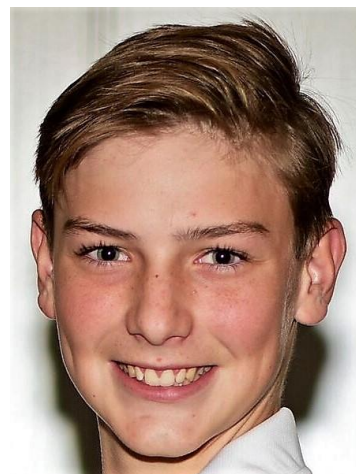

Best not enough

Memorable captain's knock but West unable to chase runs down

COACHES' ASSOCIATION

The **Hornsby, Ku-ring-gai & Hills District Cricket Coaches' Association Inc.** (HKHDCCA) was established in 2010 and is a *not-for-profit* sporting organisation responsible for recruiting and accrediting young coaches from north-western Sydney and conducting junior cricket clinics during the school holidays and development programs in the off-season. The Coaches' Association designs and implements coaching programs aimed at increasing the cricket participation, skills and enjoyment of boys and girls aged U/6 – U/16, including beginners, club players, representative standard players, disadvantaged groups, and children with special needs. HKHDCCA also organises an U/15 overseas cricket tour every two years with NDCC. Our Association's responsibilities include:

- raising the profile of coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association;
- promoting the objective that all club and representative coaches attain the Cricket Australia Community (Level 1) accreditation as a minimum (preferably Level 2 for representative Shield team coaches);
- conducting an annual Community (Level 1) accredited coaching course for HK&HDCA and NDCC members.
- organising cricket clinics at Waitara, West Pennant Hills, Dundas, Hornsby & Normanhurst, in partnership with Northern District CC, during the September / October and January school holidays for players aged 6 – 14;
- conducting an annual off-season Specialist Coaching Program for representative standard players aged 11-15;
- implementing an annual off-season development coaching program for U/10 – U/11 players at James Park over 6 Sundays during the Winter months, designed to fast-track their transition from soft to hard ball cricket;
- representing the Coaches' Association on all cricket coaching matters at the HK&HDCA Council and Executive Meetings (the President of the Coaches' Association is the delegate on the Executive Committee);
- providing active Coaches' Association members with professional coaching opportunities at our Junior Cricket Clinics and our off-season junior development programs;
- **co-ordinating the annual U/15 Ross Turner Cup (RTC) and U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) 'showcase' intra-Association representative fixtures, including the preliminary GHC T20 matches, in September each year;**
- identifying potential outstanding young coaches and providing GHC coaching roles and other opportunities;
- recognising excellence in cricket coaching at club, representative or Coaches' Association levels through our HKHDCCA *Coach of Year* award (Bruce Wood Cup);
- administering a scholarship scheme designed to provide financial assistance to a limited number of candidates nominated to attend a Cricket NSW accredited coaching course (Level 1, 2 or 3);
- assisting the HK&HDCA Rep. Secretary with coaching matters relating to the representative program, including the provision of qualified coaches to rep. teams as required, and the end-of-season appraisal;
- increasing the participation of girls in cricket through targeted coaching programs, liaison with schools and local clubs, and organised Super 8 cricket competitions;
- enhancing the development of accredited coaches and facilitating a future pathway for club and rep. coaches;
- providing a mentor service to coaches as required, especially new or young coaches seeking guidance;
- seeking corporate sponsorship and Government Grant opportunities to provide additional funding to expand and further subsidise our coaching programs, and also purchase additional equipment as required;
- arranging a HKHDCCA / NDCC overseas rep. cricket tour (U/15 age group) every couple of years from 2015;
- enabling the Association to maintain a database record of all Level 1, 2 & 3 accredited coaches;
- ensuring that all coaches aged 18 and over have a current *Working with Children* Check clearance;
- one-on-one (or small groups) private coaching on request, depending on the availability of suitable coaches;
- conducting a free Beginners session, teaching cricket fundamentals to 'first time' players aged U/8 or older;
- assisting clubs by running some coaching sessions and demonstrating coaching drills to new club coaches;
- holding two free annual clinics each year for Blowfly cricketers (children with special needs) in January and September, plus ad-hoc coaching on Saturdays, depending on the availability of coaches;
- supporting local indoor cricket centres with their various programs;
- providing cricket coaching for community groups from non-English speaking backgrounds who have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket in Sydney.

Bruce Wood has performed the role of President of the Coaches' Association since 2010-11 and is supported by **Daniel Wood** (Vice-President), **Josh Miller** (Secretary), **Rod Hokin** (Head Coach), and **Nick Miller** (Treasurer).

The Coaches' Association has five distinguished Patrons – **Ross Turner**, **Tom Richmond OAM**, **Matt Kean MP**, **Mark Rushton** and **Denise Anderson**.

INDUCTION OF COACHES' ASSOCIATION'S THIRD LIFE MEMBER – BRUCE G. WOOD

One of the highlights of the Coaches' Association's 8th AGM on 16 May 2017 was the induction of **Bruce Wood** as our third Life Member, following Tom Richmond OAM (2014) and Rod Hokin (2015).

Rod Hokin, Head Coach, Coaches' Association, was the nominator for this award and advised that Bruce has been coaching cricket in the district for two decades, having coached 25 club, representative, touring or school teams since 1997. Bruce is also a Life Member of three other cricket bodies – Normanhurst-Warrawee CC (2007), Barker CC (2010) and HK&HDCA (2013), which illustrates his long-term commitment to cricket and his outstanding achievements in the local cricket community.

Mark Rushton – Founder, Blowfly Cricket; Life Member HK&HDCA (and Patron – Coaches' Association) advised that he first met Bruce in 1997 and has enjoyed working with him over many shared interests in cricket for the past 20 years. Mark arranged a meeting with Bruce in 2010 to discuss the idea of setting up a new Coaches' Association, which hadn't been done before. The scores from our 8 matches are summarised below, which clearly reflect a successful tour (6 wins and 2 losses to U/17 teams). After winning our first 4 matches on tour quite easily (batting first), our officials were introduced to Steven Leslie, Director of Cricket, Barbados Cricket Association, who arranged a match against the Barbados U/17 National Team at the 3Ws Oval, a First Class venue within the campus of the University of the West Indies. It was a great experience playing against some future West Indian Test players and this proved to be a tour highlight.

Tom Richmond, OAM

(Founder of RTC annual fixtures)

Tom has had a wonderful 50 year career of continuous involvement in cricket coaching, ranging through various school teams, club teams, inter-district HK&HDCA representative teams, A.W. Green Shield, Northern Cricket 'Winter Spin' program and the Ross Turner Cup.

A brief summary of his amazing career follows:

- Played for Barker College 1st XI in 1957; Teachers' College Wagga Wagga; North Coast Inter-district teams; Kissing Point, Perseverance, Thornleigh and Berowra. Played A Grade as both a pace bowler and a leg spinner. Captained Thornleigh A Grade. Played HK&HDCA Martin Shield representative cricket.
- Country Coaching: Coached Woodenbong (1960-61) in Saturday morning competition in Kyogle, travelling forty miles each week to do so.
- School Cricket: coached 1st XIs at Woodenbong, Bonalbo, Normanhurst, Riverstone and Galston high schools. Cricket convener in North-West Metropolitan Zone, President of Blacktown and Ku-ring-gai Zones. Combined High Schools selector and team manager.
- A.W. Green Shield: coached ND Green Shield in about 16 seasons, including winning the club's first Green Shield, as well as several undefeated seasons as either coach or manager. Manager / Coach of several Combined Green Shield teams in matches against the country.
- Representative Cricket for HK&HDCA: coached about 20 separate teams, mainly in Watson Shield.
- Umpired several finals and did NSWPSSA matches against Queensland on a couple of occasions.
- During 1970's initiated and organised coaching seminars at Hornsby prior to the introduction of the certificate system. Organised first training for coach certificates in the Association (about 1980). Organised, with Col Cooper, first major coaching venture across the Association during the 1980's.
- **Life Member of HK&HDCA since 1981 and current Patron.**
- Within the Association, held offices of Publicity Officer, Representative Secretary, Vice President and liaison officer with Northern District. Also acted as Publicity Officer for NDCC briefly.
- Inaugural Chairperson of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council (NMCC) in 1993, bringing together grade clubs, associations, schools and shires clubs. Foundation Director of 'Northern Cricket' in 1997, a body which provided organised coaching to HK&HDCA junior players.
- **Inaugurated the HK&HDCA showcase representative fixture known as the (U/15) Ross Turner Cup in 1998-99 and organised these matches until 2010.**
- Following the success of the RTC contests, he played a significant role in adding the Glenn Hourigan Cup fixture for the younger representative age groups in 2003-04, which he organised until 2010.
- Organised and conducted specialist spin bowling coaching (known as the *Winter Spin* program) for HK&HDCA junior rep. players at James Park, Hornsby, during the off-season from 1999 to 2007.
- HK&HDCA representative player of year trophy is named after him, as is the NSWDCA junior coaches' trophy.
- Awarded the Australian Sports Medal (services to cricket); the Order of Australia Medal (services to youth); Australian Centenary Medal (services to local history); and the Premiers' Community Service Award (service to the community).
- Has written cricket coverage, especially focusing on the A Grade competition, for the Hornsby Advocate newspaper in recent years.
