# What is the Ross Turner Cup?

The HK&HDCA Ross Turner Cup (RTC) was inaugurated in 1998-99 to promote an opportunity for the best of our U/15 players to appear in a 'showcase' game of high-level representative cricket. The idea developed from the work of the Northern Metropolitan Cricket Council (NMCC) in the 1990's, which brought together representatives of grade, shires, district and local school cricket organisations to achieve mutual benefit by working in close collaboration.



One of the objectives was to accelerate the 'career paths' of our outstanding young cricketers by the early identification of players with talent and commitment, in order to provide high level coaching and development opportunities for these players. It was hoped that many of these players would successfully progress through the HK&HDCA Shield junior representative teams; play AW Green Shield and Grade Cricket with Northern District CC; or A Grade within the HK&HDCA Senior Competition. An amazing 45 players have graduated from the RTC match to play First Grade cricket in Sydney.

The RTC and Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) matches were the brainchild of the late **Tom Richmond** OAM, Patron and Life Member of HK&HDCA, who passed on the responsibility after 12 years to **Bruce Wood** OAM, President, Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) in 2010-11, who has maintained the fine tradition and introduced some new initiatives, including appointing young RTC and GHC coaches, and scheduling the 50-over matches on adjacent ovals.

The NMCC recognised that cricket needs to be played in the true spirit of the game and enjoyed by all participants, in a competitive and healthy environment. The Council took proactive steps in conjunction with the local cricket bodies to achieve this objective. An emphasis on respect for the opposition, the umpires and the laws of the game became a feature of the annual RTC matches before the world's governing body incorporated the *spirit of cricket* in the preamble to the MCC Laws of Cricket. Bruce Wood holds similar views on how cricket should be played and donated an impressive perpetual trophy in 2008-09 on behalf of the Umpires' Association entitled 'HKHDCUA *Spirit of Cricket* Award for representative cricket' in order to promote excellent sportsmanship by our cricketers.

The Cup is named in honour of **Ross Turner**, one of HK&HDCA's finest products. As a young player, Ross was a brilliant all-rounder who bowled leg-spin, batted beautifully (left-handed) and was without peer in the field. He played for Pennant Hills CC, HK&HDCA rep. teams and later became a specialist batter and Northern District's most successful captain, winning two First Grade premierships in 1985-86 and 1986-87. Ross became a Life Member of NDCC on 13 July 1994 and the Coaches' Association on 7 June 2021. Ross worked for Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia, pioneering development activities, before being appointed in 1998 as the Global Development Manager for the International Cricket Council (ICC), based at Lords in London, where he facilitated the development of cricket in emerging cricket nations such as Bangladesh, Nepal, China, Malaysia, Kenya, Zimbabwe, Uganda, Afghanistan, Canada, Denmark, Netherlands and Ireland. He is now the Director of Cricket at Newington College at Stanmore, and the Convenor of GPS cricket in Sydney. Unfortunately, Ross was unavailable to attend the 26<sup>th</sup> RTC match this year.

It is important that HK&HDCA maintains close ties with its local grade club, Northern District CC at Waitara, as our Association is the main feeder of talented players to grade cricket. NDCC officials have attended nearly every Ross Turner Cup match since its inception 26 years ago. Significant steps have been taken over the years to improve the pathway from the HK&HDCA representative teams to NDCC's U/16 AW Green Shield squad and lower grade teams. The Coaches' Association's U/15 Boys tours to Sri Lanka in 2015, West Indies / USA in 2017, India in 2019 & 2023, and its forthcoming U/17 Girls tour to India in April 2024, plus its popular junior cricket clinics at Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara in the school holidays, are / were all undertaken in conjunction with Northern District CC, further fostering the strong link with our local grade club. The Coaches' Association's Secretary, Josh Miller (Representative – Level 2), is the current NDCC U/16 AW Green Shield Head Coach (NSW Premier Cricket undefeated premiers in 2018-19 and 2020-21), after replacing Rod Hokin (High Performance – Level 3 – HKHDCCA Head Coach) in the role about 7 years ago.

This year's 26<sup>th</sup> annual RTC (50 over) match brought together the leading U/15 and U/14 players in the district. We thank the HK&HDCA sponsors, Kookaburra Sport (Cameron Eve) for supplying the match balls, stumps and Player of the Match awards.

#### **RTC MATCH REPORT**

The 26<sup>th</sup> RTC match took place on Sunday, 11<sup>th</sup> February 2024 at Turramurra Oval. The Coaches' Association appointed two impressive young coaches, **Connor Hindmarch** (West) and **Will McFadden** (East), who did an excellent job guiding and inspiring their teams. The RTC umpires were **Bruce Wood** OAM and **Scott Reid**.

The RTC East captain, Hamilton Seoung, won the toss and chose to bat first, on a pitch with a bit of variable bounce. Hamilton was brilliantly caught & bowled by Jared Fernandes, then had to watch his East team slump to 6/37 and 7/57. The star bowlers for the RTC West team were pace bowler, Finlay Hitchcock (3/17 off 7 overs), and spinner, Ulrich Vosser (2/9 off 6 overs). Edward Byrom also chipped in with two wickets. The RTC East team staged a recovery with a 40 run, 8<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership between Oliver Makin (21) and Suhas Abeysinghe (21). Ansh Gupta (16) and Marcus Neilly (10 no) enabled the East team to reach a reasonable total score of 122 runs, and bat their full 50 overs, which appeared unlikely when they were struggling on 6/37 after 19 overs.

In reply, the RTC West team cruised to victory in 30.1 overs, led by their opening batter, Jagbir Malhi (64) and Josh McDowell (26). Kirby Mulligan came in at # 5 and hit a quick 12 not out to seal the win. The match was played in very good spirits, in keeping with the RTC tradition. The umpires presented the historic RTC trophy to the West team, led by Zach Rapa (Captain) and Connor Hindmarch (Coach).

#### UMPIRES FOR ROSS TURNER CUP MATCH 2023-24

**Scott Reid** is the Executive Officer (and Life Member) of HK&HDCA; and a former President of the Umpires' Association (HKHDCUA). He has umpired over 200 matches for HKHDCUA since 1998-99, plus four NSWDCA / NSWYC Shield Finals; the Final of the NSW Schools Championship Cup in November 2019; five RTC and two GHC fixtures. Scott is in his 33<sup>rd</sup> season as a player for Beecroft CC in the HK&HDCA competitions, starting in the U/16s back in 1985-86. He served 10 seasons on both the Association's Executive and Senior Competition Committee between 1994-95 to 2004-05. Scott jointly holds (with Adam Nash – 329) the HK&HDCA record for the highest partnership for any wicket in any Senior grade – 7<sup>th</sup> wicket, 427 runs in the B Reserve Grade Final at Parklands Oval in 1990-91 (Scott scored 212 no in a team total of 725). Scott has scored over 9,500 runs in senior cricket, including seven centuries and 49 half-centuries; won four Association batting awards, and played in seven HK&HDCA premiership teams.




**Bruce Wood** OAM received an Order of Australia Medal in 2022 for his service to cricket. He was recognised by Cricket NSW and Cricket Australia as the *Community Match Official of the Year* at the national 'A Sport For All' Awards in 2020; and featured in the Cricket Sydney publication: bit.ly/BGW-Cricket-Oct-2020. Bruce has been a member of the HK&HDCA Executive Committee since 2007; President of the Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) since 2010; RTC / GHC Convenor since 2010; Hon. Umpires' Co-ordinator for the Associated Schools of NSW (CAS) since 2017. He was also elected as the inaugural President of the Australia–India Women's Cricket Association (AIWCA) in 2023. He is an experienced Representative (Level 2) accredited coach, having coached school, club, rep. and touring teams since 1997-98, including HK&HDCA's undefeated U/15 Weblin Shield Boys premiership team in 2005-06. He was Head Coach on HK&HDCA's first overseas tours to India in 2006, and New Zealand in 2007. He was the Manager (and



umpire) on the HKHDCCA U/15 Boys tours to Sri Lanka (2015); West Indies (2017); India (2019); and India (2023). The Association's prestigious *Coach of the Year* perpetual trophy (Bruce Wood Cup) is named in his honour in recognition of his exemplary work and achievements in the field of cricket coaching over more than two decades. Bruce is an experienced NSWCUSA Level 2 qualified umpire who has officiated in over 770 matches since 2001-02, including 60+ Grand Finals (one at the SCG and one at Bradman Oval, Bowral). He is a respected Life Member of four cricket bodies – HK&HDCA; Coaches' Association; Barker CC & Normanhurst-Warrawee CC. Bruce jointly holds the HK&HDCA record for the highest 5<sup>th</sup> wicket batting partnership in any Senior grade – 320\* runs set in 2000-01 for Normanhurst-Warrawee CC (he scored 138 no at Normanhurst Oval).







# Coaches' Association

The **Coaches' Association** (HKHDCCA) is an inclusive NFP cricket coaching organisation responsible for recruiting and accrediting young coaches from within HK&HDCA and north-western Sydney; and conducting junior cricket clinics during the school holidays and development programs in the off-season. HKHDCCA designs and implements coaching programs aimed at increasing the cricket participation, skills and enjoyment of boys and girls aged 5-15, including beginners, club players,



representative standard players, and children with special needs. HKHDCCA has experienced significant growth since our inception in 2010 and aim to continue to expand our subsidised (or free) coaching programs to a wider cross-section of the community, many of whom have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket, including disadvantaged groups, children from non-English speaking communities, and children with special needs. We also strongly support the growth of Girls' cricket at grassroots, club and representative levels. The successful implementation of these initiatives assists in facilitating sporting, cultural and social inclusion for these community groups, while also promoting healthy, active lifestyles, and increasing the participation rate in cricket in NSW. Responsibilities include:

- raising the profile of cricket coaching and giving coaches a collective 'voice' within the Association;
- promoting the objective that all club and representative coaches attain the Cricket Australia Community (Level 1) accreditation as a minimum, (preferably Level 2 for representative Shield team coaches);
- organising annual Community (Level 1) accredited coaching courses for HK&HDCA and NDCC members.
- organising cricket clinics for players aged 6 14 at Waitara, Cherrybrook, Normanhurst, West Pennant Hills and Hornsby, in partnership with Northern District CC, during the January, April, July and Sept./Oct. school holidays;
- representing the Coaches' Association on all cricket coaching matters at the HK&HDCA General and Executive Meetings (the President of the Coaches' Association is a delegate on the Executive Committee);
- providing active Coaches' Association members with professional coaching opportunities at our school holiday cricket clinics and other junior development programs;
- co-ordinating the annual HK&HDCA U/15 Ross Turner Cup (RTC) and U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) 'showcase' intra-Association representative fixtures;
- identifying potential outstanding young coaches; providing RTC & GHC coaching roles and other opportunities;
- recognising excellence in cricket coaching at club, representative or Coaches' Association levels through our HKHDCCA Coach of the Year award (Bruce Wood Cup);
- arranging representative cricket tours overseas for boys and/or girls, at least every two years (since 2015);
- providing financial assistance to a limited number of HKHDCCA candidates nominated to attend a Cricket NSW accredited coaching course (Levels 2 or 3), as Community (Level 1) courses are free;
- increasing the participation of girls in cricket, in consultation with Cricket NSW (Sydney Sixers) and the HK&HDCA Girls Cricket Co-ordinator, through targeted coaching programs and liaison with schools and clubs;
- conducting a free Beginners session, teaching cricket fundamentals to 'first time' players, on an annual basis;
- assisting clubs by running some coaching sessions and demonstrating coaching drills to new club coaches;
- holding free coaching sessions each year for BlowFly cricketers (children and adults with special needs), plus ad-hoc coaching at other programs, depending on the availability of our coaches; providing volunteer services at BlowFly Cricket fund-raising events and other programs;
- enhancing the development of accredited coaches and facilitating a future pathway for club and rep. coaches;
- providing a mentor service to coaches as required, especially new or young coaches seeking guidance;
- arranging Insurance for HKHDCCA and the annual incorporated association return to NSW Fair Trading;
- seeking corporate sponsorship and Government Grant opportunities to provide additional funding to expand and further subsidise our coaching programs, and purchase uniforms and additional equipment as required;
- ensuring that all coaches aged 18 and over have a current Working with Children Check 5-year clearance;
- promoting our activities and coaching programs via the Coaches' Association's social media (Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn and Twitter);
- assisting the HK&HDCA Rep. Secretary with coaching matters relating to the representative program;
- aiming to provide cricket coaching for community groups from non-English speaking backgrounds who have encountered barriers or lack of opportunities to participate in cricket in Sydney.

**Bruce Wood** OAM has been President of the Coaches' Association since 2010-11 and is supported by **Braden Cheng** (Vice-President), **Josh Miller** (Secretary), **Rod Hokin** (Head Coach), and **Dylan Bish** (Treasurer).

The Coaches' Association has five distinguished Patrons – **Ross Turner**, **Mark Rushton**, **Alf James** OAM, **Denise Anderson** (Annetts), and **Matt Kean MP** (Member for Hornsby).
